## Safety and use .....

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your phone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

### • TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given that studies show that using a mobile phone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their mobile when the vehicle is not parked.

When driving, do not use your phone and headphone to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas.

When switched on, your phone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your phone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area,
- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the dashboard is adequately shielded from mobile phone RF energy.

### • CONDITIONS OF USE:

You are advised to switch off the telephone from time to time to optimise its performance.

Switch the phone off before boarding an aircraft.

Switch the phone off when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, mobile telephones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency.

Switch the phone off when you are near gas or flammable liquids. Strictly obey all signs and instructions posted in a fuel depot, petrol station, or chemical plant, or in any potentially explosive atmosphere.

When the phone is switched on, it should be kept at least 15 cm from any medical device such as a pacemaker, a hearing aid or insulin pump, etc. In particular when using the phone, you should hold it against the ear on the opposite side to the device, if any.

To avoid hearing impairment, pick up the call before holding your phone to your ear. Also move the handset away from your ear while using the "hands-free" mode because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

Do not let children use the phone without supervision.

When replacing the cover please note that your phone may contain substances that could create an allergic reaction.

Always handle your phone with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.

Do not allow your phone to be exposed to adverse weather or environmental conditions (moisture, humidity, rain, infiltration of liquids, dust, sea air, etc.). The manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range is -10°C to +55°C.

At over 55°C the legibility of the phone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.

Emergency call numbers may not be reachable on all cellular networks. You should never rely only on your phone for emergency calls.

Do not open, dismantle or attempt to repair your mobile phone yourself.

Do not drop, throw or bend your mobile phone.

Do not paint it.

Use only batteries, battery chargers, and accessories which are recommended by TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates and are compatible with your phone model (see Accessories List, page 73). TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates disclaim any liability for damage caused by the use of other chargers or batteries.

Remember to make back-up copies or keep a written record of all important information stored in your phone.

Some people may suffer epileptic seizures or blackouts when exposed to flashing lights, or when playing video games. These seizures or blackouts may occur even if a person never had a previous seizure or blackout. If you have experienced seizures or blackouts, or if you have a family history of such occurrences, please consult your doctor before playing video games on your phone or enabling a flashing-lights feature on your phone.

Parents should monitor their children's use of video games or other features that incorporate flashing lights on the phones. All persons should discontinue use and consult a doctor if any of the following symptoms occur: convulsion, eye or muscle twitching, loss of awareness, involuntary movements, or disorientation. To limit the likelihood of such symptoms, please take the following safety precautions:

- Do not play or use a flashing-lights feature if you are tired or need sleep.
- Take a minimum of a 15-minute break hourly.
- Play in a room in which all lights are on.
- Play at the farthest distance possible from the screen.
- If your hands, wrists, or arms become tired or sore while playing, stop and rest for several hours before playing again.
- If you continue to have sore hands, wrists, or arms during or after playing, stop the game and see a doctor.

When you play games on your phone, you may experience occasional discomfort in your hands, arms, shoulders, neck, or other parts of your body. Follow the instructions to avoid problems such as tendinitis, carpal tunnel syndrome, or other musculoskeletal disorders.



Prolonged exposure to music at full volume on the music player may damage the listener's hearing.

Set your phone volume safely. Use only headphones recommended by TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates.

#### • **PRIVACY:**

Please note that you must respect the laws and regulations in force in your jurisdiction or other jurisdiction(s) where you will use your mobile phone regarding taking photographs and recording sounds with your mobile telephone. Pursuant to such laws and regulations, it may be strictly forbidden to take photographs and/or to record the voices of other people or any of their personal attributes, and duplicate or distribute them, as this may be considered to be an invasion of privacy. #### • **BATTERY:**

Before removing the battery from your phone, please make sure that the phone is switched off. Observe the following precautions for battery use:

- Do not attempt to open the battery (due to the risk of toxic fumes and burns).
- Do not puncture, disassemble or cause a short-circuit in a battery.
- Do not burn or dispose of a used battery in household rubbish or store it at temperatures above 60 °C.

Your mobile phone is a radio transmitter/receiver. It was designed and manufactured to comply with the radiofrequency (RF) exposure thresholds recommended by international requirements (ICNIRP) <sup>(1)</sup> and by the Council of the European Union (Recommendation 1999/519/EC) <sup>(2)</sup>.

These limits are part of a set of requirements and establish authorised radiofrequency levels for the public. These limits were established by independent groups of experts on the basis of regular and detailed scientific assessments. They include a significant safety margin intended to ensure the safety of all, regardless of age or state of health.

The exposure standard for mobile phones is determined by a measurement unit known as the Specific Absorption Rate or "SAR". The SAR limit is set by international requirements or by the Council of the European Union at 2 watts/kilogram (W/kg) averaged over 10 grams of body tissue. The tests used to determine SAR levels were carried out on the basis of standard usage modes with the phones transmitting at their maximum power level over the entire range of frequency bands.

Although the SAR was established at the highest certified level, the actual SAR level for the mobile phone during use is generally much lower than the maximum values. In fact, since mobile phones are designed to operate at many different power levels, they only use the minimum level of power required to provide a connection to the network. In theory, the closer you are to a base station antenna, the lower the power level required by the mobile phone.

<sup>(1)</sup> The ICNIRP requirements are applicable in the following regions: Central America (except Mexico), South America, North and South Africa, Pacific Asia (except Korea), Australia.

<sup>(2)</sup> The European recommendation (1999/519/EC) is applicable in the following regions: Europe, Israel.

The highest tested SAR value for this mobile phone for use at the ear and compliance against the standard is 1.0 W/kg. While there may be differences between the SAR levels on various phones and at various positions, they all meet the relevant International guidelines and EU requirements for RF (radio-waves) exposure.

The World Health Organisation (WHO) considers that present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for use of mobile phones. If individuals are concerned, they might choose to limit their own or their children's RF exposure by limiting the length of calls, or using "hands-free" devices to keep mobile phones away from the head and body (fact sheet n° 193). 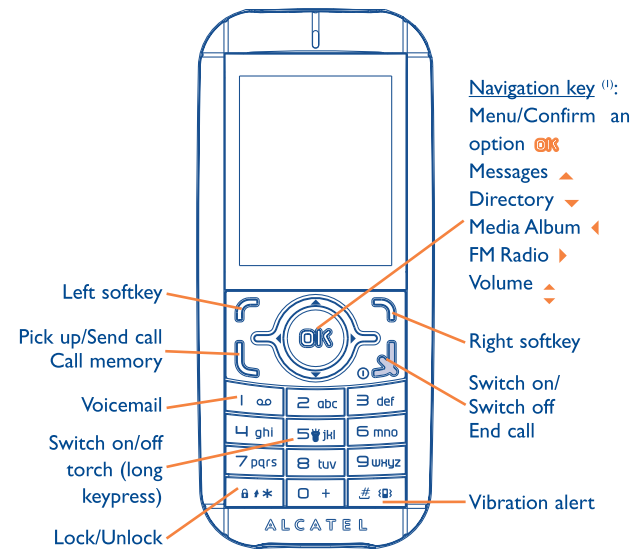
### Protection against theft <sup>(1)</sup>

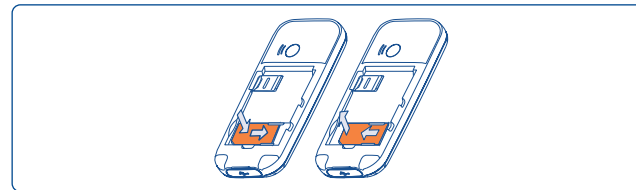

## 2 Getting started .....

### 2.1 Set-up

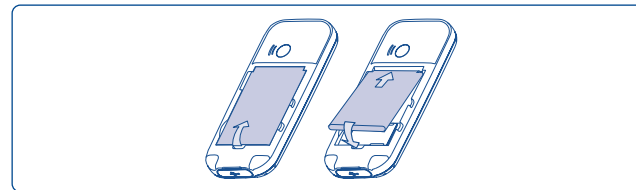
#### Inserting and removing the SIM card <sup>(1)</sup>

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls.



Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the card, press it and slide it out. Please power off your phone before you remove the SIM card.

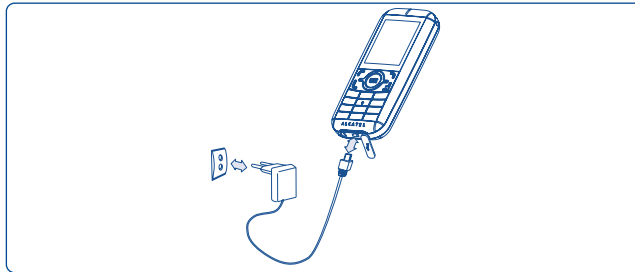
#### Installing the battery



Insert and click the battery into place, then close the telephone cover.

<sup>(1)</sup> Check with your network operator to make sure that your SIM card is 3V compatible. The old 5 Volt cards can no longer be used. Please contact your operator.

### Charging the battery



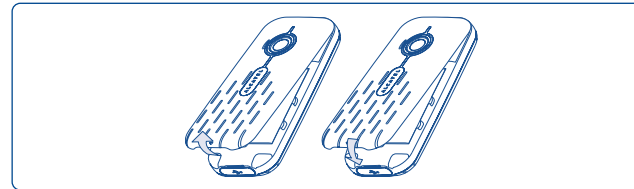
Connect the battery charger

- The charging may take about 20 minutes to start if the battery is flat.
- Be careful not to force the plug into the socket.
- Make sure the battery is correctly inserted before connecting the charger.
- The mains socket must be near to the phone and easily accessible (avoid electric extension cables).
- When using your telephone for the first time, charge the battery fully (approximately 3 hours). You are advised to fully charge the battery (  ).



The charge is complete when the animation stops. Only use Alcatel chargers.

## 2.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the  key until the telephone powers on, type in your PIN code if necessary and then confirm with the  key. The main screen is displayed.



If you don't know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code near your telephone and store your card in a safe place when not in use.

If cell broadcast messages are displayed, use the  key to browse through them in full or press the right softkey to return to the main screen.

While the phone is searching for a network, "**Searching/Emergency**" will be displayed.

In the power on screen, you also have access to "**Media album**", "**Camera**" and "**Multimedia player**" functions even if no SIM card inside.

## 2.3 Power off your phone

Hold down the  key from the main screen.

# 3 Calls .....

## 3.1 Making a call

Dial the desired number then press the  key to place the call. If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by pressing the right softkey.

To hang up the call, press the  key.



To enter characters "+", "V" (for tonewait) or "P" (used to store a number with extension number), hold down the  + key (the following characters will scroll by: 0, +, P, V).

### Making an emergency call

If your phone is covered by the network, dial emergency number and press the  key to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code or unlocking the keypad.

## 3.2 Calling your voicemail <sup>(1)</sup>

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time. To access your voicemail, hold down the  key.

<sup>(1)</sup> Contact your network operator to check service availability.

If the access number for your operator's voicemail service does not work, dial the number that you were given. To change this number at a later date, refer to **"My numbers"** (see page 27).



To use your voicemail service from abroad, contact your network operator before leaving.

### 3.3 Receiving a call

When you receive an incoming call, press the  key to talk and then hang up using the  key.

If the  icon is displayed, the vibrator is activated and there is no ringtone. If the  icon is displayed, the phone neither rings nor vibrates.



The caller's number is displayed if it is transmitted by the network (contact your network operator to check service availability).

#### Muting the ringtone

Press the right softkey once while the telephone is ringing. Answer the call by pressing the  key.

#### Rejecting a call

Press the  key once or the right softkey twice.

### 3.4 During the call

#### Available functions

During a call, you can use your directory, your diary, short messages, etc. without losing your correspondent by pressing the  key.

### Adjusting the volume

You can adjust the sound level during a call using the  key.

### Handling two calls

- Answering a second call (Ensure that **“Call waiting”** is activated, see page 28).
- To call a second party during a call, dial the number directly.

### 3.5 Conference calls <sup>(1)</sup>

Your phone allows you to talk to several people at the same time (up to 5). If you are on a double call, press **“Options”** and select **“Conference”** then confirm with the  key. If a third call comes in, answer it by pressing the  key and speak with your new correspondent.

This correspondent becomes a member of the conference if you press **“Options”** and select **“Add to conference”**, and then confirm by pressing . Pressing  disconnects the current call.

To end the conference call, press **“Options”** and select **“End conf.”**.

<sup>(1)</sup> Contact your network operator to check service availability.

### 3.6 Line switching <sup>(1)</sup>

Your SIM card can contain two distinct telephone numbers. Under **“Call register”**, choose **“Line switching”** and then select a default line; all your outgoing calls will be made from this number. Incoming calls, however, will continue to use the two lines.



The services programmed on the default line do not impact those selected on the other line.

## 5 Call register .....

### 5.1 Call memory

You can access your call memory by pressing the  key from the main screen. Choose the option of the desired list:

-  Unanswered calls
-  Outgoing calls (Redial)
-  Answered calls

Select a number of the call memory and press the “**Options**” softkey to **View** call details, **Create text/multimedia message**, **Save** or **Delete** the selected number or clear the entire list (**Delete all**).

### 5.2 My numbers

Type in or modify your telephone number or the number to access your voicemail and confirm by pressing . Your telephone number is usually written on your SIM card.

### 5.3 Billing

You can access different items with this option:

- Amount**
  - You can view the total cost of charged calls, modify it or reset it and enter the cost of a Telecom Unit in the currency of your choice.
- Duration**
  - You can view the total duration of all outgoing calls or reset it.
- GPRS counter**
  - Management of the volume of data communications charged for (in kilobytes).
- Beep duration**
  - You can activate or cancel the beep emitted during a call with a specified frequency (enter the frequency and confirm by .

### 5.4 Call settings <sup>(1)</sup>

You can access a number of items with this option:

#### 5.4.1 Call waiting

Activate/deactivate the notification of a second incoming call by a beep.

#### 5.4.2 Call forwarding

You can activate, cancel or verify the status of the call forwarding to the voicemail or to a specified number. The following configurations are possible:

- Unconditional: systematic forwarding of all your calls. The  icon is displayed.

- Conditional: if your line is busy, if you don't answer or if you are outside the network range.
- If busy, no reply or unreachable.

#### 5.4.3 Call barring

## 6 Directory .....

### 6.1 Consulting your directory

To access the **directory** from the main screen, press the ▼ key <sup>(1)</sup> or press the  key and select the  icon from the menu.

You can also customise a quick access to your contact with the keypad customisation (see page 41).

You have 4 directories:

-  SIM directory
-  General
-  Phone directory
-  Group

In addition to the directories already provided, you can create up to 5 groups (maximum 100 entries per group).

#### Searching for a name by its first letter

You can search for the person's name by pressing the key associated with the first letter of his/her name.

#### Read a file

Select a name from your directory, then press  to read the file.

#### Sending Vcard via Bluetooth

Selecting the Vcard you wish to transfer ("**Options\Send vCard\By Bluetooth**").

#### Making the call

Press the  key once the name is selected. If several numbers are associated with the name to be called, you must first choose the number from the list (Mobile, Home, Office, etc.) using the  key. Press the  key to make the call.



Information in the directory and the diary may be sent to and received from a computer using the PC suite.

## 6.2 Creating a file

Select the directory in which you wish to create a file, press the **"Options"** softkey, select **"Create file"** then **OK**.

## 7 Messages.....

You can create, edit and receive SMS, MMS and email with this mobile phone.

MMS is a message whereby you can send images, photos, animations and sounds to other compatible mobiles and e-mail addresses.



The MMS function can only be used if the service is provided by your operator, and if your contract includes the MMS option and if all the parameters for MMS have been entered (see page 38).

### 7.1 Messages:Text/Multimedia message <sup>(1)</sup>

#### 7.1.1 Create message

From the main menu select "**Messages**" to create text/multimedia message.

You can type a message but you can also modify a predefined message in **Templates** or customize your message by adding pictures, photos, sounds, titles, etc (only available while editing a MMS). While writing a message, select "**Options**" to access all the messaging options.

<sup>(1)</sup> Depending on your network operator.

You can save your messages that you send often to **Drafts** or **Templates**.



An SMS message of more than 160 characters (the number of characters depends on the languages you writing in) will be charged as several SMS. An MMS message containing photos and/or sounds may also be billed as more than one message.

#### 7.1.2 Inbox

All received messages (read and unread) are stored in the same Inbox.

When viewing your messages, you will find the following status icons, depending on the type of message:  unread SMS in phone,  unread SMS in SIM card,  read SMS in phone,  read SMS in SIM card,  unread MMS in phone,  read MMS in phone,  message reception in progress and  message sending in progress.

#### Receiving and reading SMS/MMS

When you receive a new message, the following message is displayed: "**X new message!**", a beep sounds, the  icon shows up, a line with the number of messages appears on the screen. Select this line and press **OK** to read it directly from the main screen.

Once you have read the message, the following options are given: **Reply**, **Forward** the message to another person, **Edit**, **Delete**, **Delete all** and extract number or URL (**Use number/Use URL**).

#### 7.1.3 Unsent

All failed to be sent messages.

#### 7.1.4 Sent

All sent messages.

### 7.1.5 Drafts

All drafts messages.

### 7.1.6 WAP alerts

Store WAP push messages.

### 7.1.7 Empty folder

Delete all messages in “Inbox/Unsent/Sent/Drafts”.

### 7.1.8 Templates

A list of predefined messages is available. Select one, edit it if required, and then send it. You can also create your own predefined text messages.

## 7.2 Voice message

Record voice and send as MMS.

## 7.3 Photo message

Take a photo and send as MMS.

## 7.4 Voicemail

All vocal messages received.

## 7.5 Settings

### 7.5.1 Text message

**Profile settings** • Profiles can be retrieved directly from SIM card. Alternatively, you can create your own profile.

**General setting** • Delivery report, request for acknowledgement of delivery report On/Off. Reply path <sup>(1)</sup> show reply path.

**Memory status** • Memory used on the phone.

**Preferred storage** • Select default message storage, SIM or phone.

**Pref. Bearer** • Bearer preference.

### 7.5.2 Multimedia message

**Edit** • Set edit mode, image size and signature.

**Sending** • Set the values for validity period, Read report, etc.

**Retrieve** • Set the values for Home network, Roaming network, etc.

**Filter** • Set criteria for filtering.

**Profiles** • Follow the same procedure as for setting your WAP connection.

**Memory status** • Memory used on the phone.

### 7.5.3 Broadcast SMS <sup>(1)</sup>

**Receive mode** • Enable to receive broadcast SMS.

**Read message** • Store the received messages.

**Languages** • Language selection.

**Channel setting** • Add/Edit channels.

<sup>(1)</sup> Depending on your network operator.

## 8 My settings .....

From the main screen, select the icon menu  and select the function of your choice in order to customise your telephone.

### 8.1 Ringtones

#### Available functions

To modify the sound settings, select an option using the ◀ ▶ key:

-  A group of predefined settings that allows you to quickly adapt your phone to your environment.
-  Select a melody from the list using the ◀ ▶ key then confirm by pressing **OK** (see page 61).
-  Mode: you may set your phone ringtone to Normal, Discreet (ring with beep), Vibrate (all sounds are replaced by vibrations except for alarms), Vibrate and ring, Vibrate then ring, Beep and vibrate, Silence (no sounds except for alarms, the  icon will be displayed). Ringtones sound with increasing volume.
-  Adjust the volume using the ◀ ▶ key.
-  Select the type of key beep.
-  Select a melody for a new incoming message.
-  Select a melody for an alarm or appointment.
-  Power on beep.
-  Power off beep.

### 8.2 Antenna off mode

Antenna off mode, under which you will have no voice call, Bluetooth or messaging functions, can be used to increase music playback time.

### 8.3 Display

#### 8.3.1 Main screen

The main screen is displayed when you switch on your telephone.

You can access the main functions from the main screen either with the navigation key or by pressing **OK** and by selecting the icons displayed on the screen <sup>(1)</sup>.

By selecting “**Main screen**” you can customise it by replacing the default image or animation displayed on your telephone.



When you receive an event (incoming call, SMS/MMS, notifications, etc.) the icon, type and number of events will be displayed on your main screen allowing you to consult them directly.

#### 8.3.2 Screen saver

If you activate this option, the screen saver will be displayed a little while after the main screen. You can choose a picture or an animation as your screen saver.

#### 8.3.3 Power On/Off <sup>(2)</sup>

You can customise your welcome animation or image that appears when you switch on your phone.

You can also customise your OFF screen with an image or animation.

### 8.3.4 Menu display

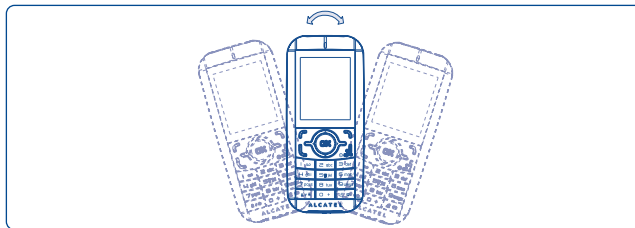
## 8.4 Shake-shake

While playing music, listening to FM Radio, being in the idle or alarming, easily skip to the previous/next song, channel, image or snooze alarm by shaking your phone heavily leftward/rightward when it is "On".

Hold down the  key to Activate/Deactivate "Shake-shake" while playing music/FM Radio or in the idle.



For better performance of battery, please turn off "Shake-shake" when unnecessary.



Only the images stored in "Media album\My images" would be detected while shaking and the resolution of images is up to 1280x1280.

## 8.5 Clock

It allows you to have settings of date and time, including 12/24h format. Also you can set the daylight saving adjustment.

## 8.6 Keys

### 8.6.1 Softkeys & Navigation key

These keys have predefined functions, which vary from one model to another (operator services, games access, or Games & Applications, ...). You can customise <sup>(1)</sup> them, assigning the functions, numbers from directory and URL you wish to each key.

### 8.6.2 Keys

By customising your keys, you can access any function directly from the main screen.

## 8.7 More settings...

### 8.7.1 Auto lock

Your keypad would be locked automatically or you may also lock it manually by holding down the  key.

#### Unlock the keypad

Hold down the  key when locked.



The keypad will be unlocked automatically on receiving a call or plugging in the charger.

### 8.7.2 Backlight

#### Screen

- It allows you to reduce brightness for better performance of batteries and save power during periods of expected inactivity.

#### Keypad

### 8.7.4 Dictionary

You have a dictionary to which you can add your own words in addition to those suggested by the predictive input system. When you consult your dictionary, you can add, modify or erase words by using the "**Options**" softkey.

### 8.7.5 Input mode <sup>(2)</sup>

Please see chapter "Latin input mode", page 67. In addition to the specific characters table for Cyrillic, Chinese, other data input modes are also available in your telephone. This feature allows you to write short messages and add names with special characters to your directory.

### 8.7.6 Security

#### Activate PIN

- The choice of the network connection is left up to the user.

- GPRS mode active depending on connection requirements.
- Always
- GPRS mode continuously active.

## 9 Tools .....

### 9.1 Bluetooth™ <sup>(1)</sup>

Access this feature by selecting “**Tools**” from the main menu, then “**Bluetooth**”.

To use your phone with a Bluetooth device, you need to proceed in two steps:

- Pair and register the device to your phone,
- Select it to use hands-free communication. Only one Bluetooth audio device (your Bluetooth headset or your Bluetooth car kit) can be connected during the communication.

#### Pair and register your Bluetooth device

Activate the Bluetooth feature by selecting the “**Tools\Bluetooth\Activation\On**” option. Then enter the “**Device list**” menu to search for connectable Bluetooth devices and select the device you want to be paired with in the list. If the Bluetooth device has no keyboard, enter its default password to register it with your phone. If the Bluetooth device has keyboard/keypad, enter the same set of password on both handset and the device to get it registered.

From the list, press the “**Options**” softkey to connect/disconnect, rename, search for new devices or delete an unconnected one from the list.

<sup>(1)</sup> You are highly recommended to use Alcatel OT-BM81 (mono) and OT-BM61 (stereo) Bluetooth headsets, which have been tested and proved fully compatible with OT-I650.



Don't forget to turn on your Bluetooth device and activate the pairing mode while pairing it with your phone.

#### Available functions

- Data transmit** • Exchange files with another bluetooth device.
- Handle a call** • Initiate or receive a phone call with a Bluetooth headset.
- Listen to music** • Support A2DP profile.

#### Settings

- **Visibility:** Select whether you want to hide (“**Hidden**”) or show to all (“**Shown to all**”) your phone.
- **My phone's name:** you may change your phone name, which is visible to the others.



Always activate Bluetooth in your phone first before connecting it to a Bluetooth device. Be aware that Bluetooth activation will slightly affect battery life of your phone.

Bluetooth technology allows free wireless connections between all Bluetooth-compliant devices within short range. Please make sure that the Bluetooth headset or the Bluetooth car kit and your mobile phone are in this range and set as “**Visibility**”.

Your phone is Bluetooth™ v1.1, v1.2 and v2.0 compatible.

### 9.2 Organizer

Once you enter this menu from “**Tools**”, there is a monthly-view calendar for you to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc. Days with events entered will be marked in color.



**Available options:**

- Create**
  - Create an appointment.
- View appointments**
  - See today's appointments.
- List all appointments**
  - See all the created appointments.
- Jump to date**
  - Input the required date and it will be immediately highlighted.

**9.3 Alarm**

Your mobile phone has a built-in alarm clock with a snooze feature. You can set up to five separate alarms and choose whether or not the alarm should repeat.

- Repeat**
  - You may select Once (default)/Every day/Days.
- Snooze**
  - The alarm will repeat at regular intervals. You may snooze it by shaking your phone (see page 41).

**9.4 Calculator**

You can use it to perform basic calculations. Hold down the  key to get the decimal point. Confirm with the  key or the left softkey.

**9.5 Converter****9.5.1 Unit converter**

You can use the Weight and Length conversion by selecting the unit you wish to convert via , then press  to input the digits. Finally confirm with  key or left softkey.

**9.5.2 Currency converter**

The currency converter allows you to:

- Convert a currency directly into euros and vice versa <sup>(1)</sup>.
- Convert between international currencies, both currencies must be selected by   keys. You are requested to input the appropriate exchange rate.

**9.6 Voice memo**

This feature enables you to record a call by selecting “**Voice memo**” while communicating. To record a sound, select “**Voice memo**”, then “**New record**”.

**9.7 Morse code**

Your phone is embedded with 20 pcs of morse messages to be sent by torch, where it blinks to attract people's attention.

## 9.8 Memory status

It will indicate how much space is used and how much is currently free on your phone and memory card (if any).

### 9.8.1 Phone memory

View available memory space.

Your phone's memory is shared among several functions: directory, scheduler, messages, voice messages, images, melodies, games and video clips.

### 9.8.2 Memory card (MicroSD card)

View the memory available on your MicroSD card.



You are advised to save large files (like songs,...) on your microSD card. File name with up to 35 characters will be supported.

## 9.9 My shortcuts

Access the shortcuts already programmed.

To programme new shortcuts: select **"My shortcuts"** if you want to create a quick access to a function, Directory, or WAP Bookmarks, etc.

## 10 Sports .....

In **"Sports"** mode, you can monitor and record your exercise, make an exercise plan, review your progress and perform tests.

### 10.1 Pedometer

Used originally by sports and physical fitness enthusiasts, pedometer help you to measure speed, distance, steps and calories burned, even you may set goals, which it could track.



An optional position, your pocket of trousers to place your phone or strapping it onto your waist is recommended for its reasonable accuracy when pedometer is activated.

### 10.2 Stopwatch

StopWatch is simple application for measuring time with possibility to register several results and suspend/resume measurement.

### 10.3 Training plans

There would be a monthly-view calendar for you to set several simultaneous targets.

### 10.4 Profiles

Up to 3 profiles to be varied from people to people for Pedometer's better performance.

### **11.1 Homepage**

Launch the WAP browser with the homepage of the default profile.

### **11.2 Bookmarks**

Access your favorite sites.

### **11.3 Recent pages**

Pages which you recently browsed.

### **11.4 Go to URL**

Enter the URL of WAP site.

### **11.5 Profiles**

#### **11.5.1 Edit profile**

Edit existing profile or create new profile.

#### **11.5.2 Browser options**

Set the value for timeout and auto loading of image.

#### **11.5.3 Push message settings**

Enable or disable receiving service message from WAP.

#### **11.5.4 Clear cache**

Empty the phone's cache memory.

#### **11.5.5 Clear cookies**

Clear cookies from website.

#### **11.5.6 Trusted certificates**

Certificates of trusted sites.

## 12 Media album

You will have an access to all audio and visual files stored in phone or memory card in Media Album.

### 12.1 My audios

Choose an audio for the ON/OFF screen, for an incoming call, a message alert, power on/off ringtone or an alarm and scheduler.

The “**My audios**” album contains the following folders <sup>(1)</sup>:

- Music: full track music.
- Melodies: melodies that can be set as ringtone.
- Recorded: all recorded sounds.
- General: contains all audio files stored in phone or memory card.



DRM: Digital Rights Management feature allows sounds and images to be played while protecting the associated copyright. DRM counter-based files and files with expired rights will not be automatically played when scrolling the list.

<sup>(1)</sup> The embedded folder names cannot be modified. However, in certain cases, you can modify, delete and add items included in these folders.

### 12.2 My images

You can select an image or a photo as main screen or the ON/OFF screen. You may also change it, send it by MMS or Bluetooth or assign it to a contact in the directory.



The images will be displayed in alphabetical order.

### 12.3 My videos

The “**My videos**” album contains all video clips embedded and downloaded in phone or memory card.

### 12.4 My creations

This feature stores all the photos captured by your mobile phone.

Thumbnails are displayed for preview. In addition, you can use “**Mark**” function, to select multiple files.

### 12.5 Unknown files

Store files of unsupported format.

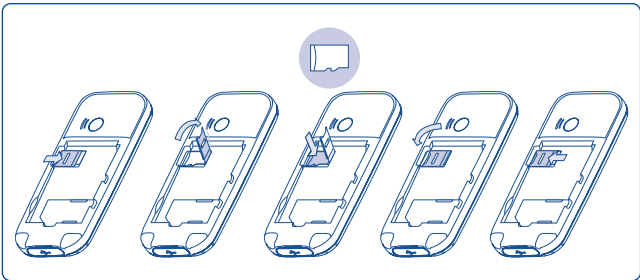
### 12.6 Memory card

You will have access to all files stored in memory card here.



When a memory card is inserted for the first time, it will be scanned and the default folders will be created.

**Insert the memory card:**

Your mobile phone is fitted with a camera for taking photos that you can use in different ways:

- store them in your “**Media album**”.
- send them in a multimedia message (MMS) to a mobile phone or an email address.
- customise your main screen (see page 40).
- select them as incoming call image to a contact in your directory.
- transfer them by data cable or microSD card to your computer.
- modify your photos through adding frames (see page 60).

## 13.1 Access

To access the function from the main screen: press the  key to access the menu and select the  icon.

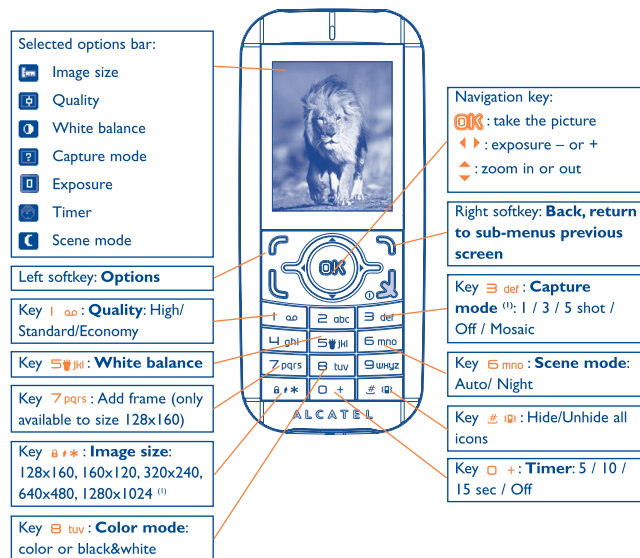
## 13.2 Camera

### 13.2.1 Take a photo, save or delete

The screen acts as the viewfinder. Position the object or landscape in the viewfinder and press  to take the picture and the pictures will be automatically saved. But if you don't want it, you may directly delete it by pressing right softkey “**Delete**”.

### 13.2.2 Settings in framing mode

Before taking the photo, you can adjust a number of settings by using the following shortcuts:

From the photo shot screen, press the “Options” softkey not only to access: “Image size”, “Capture mode”, “Quality”, “Timer”, “White balance”, “Color mode”, “Add frame”, but also following ones:

- Saving location** • You may choose saving location if MicroSD card is inserted.
- Restore default** • Make all settings recover as default value.
- Hotkeys** • List all hotkeys.

### 13.2.3 Options available after taking the photo

Once you have taken a photo, you can **Send** your photo, assign it to a contact or a main screen, etc, or **Delete** it, **Modify** it (see below), or access your **Media album**.

### 13.2.4 Modifying images

Access the “Media album\My creations” after taking a photo, and then select “Modify”.

## 4 Multimedia player .....

Access this feature from the main menu by selecting “**Multimedia player**”. You will have full flexibility of managing music both on your mobile and memory card.

### 14.1 Music player <sup>(1)</sup>

You can have access to your music files through one of the following:

- All songs**
  - Contains all songs both on phone memory and memory card.
- Playlist**
  - List created on the PC.
- Update songs**
  - Update the information of songs saved in memory card.
- Album/Artist/Genre**
  - Music files are categorized by Album, Artist or Genre based on information stored in the tags. Those missing such information will be classified as “**Unknown files**”.
- My star list**
  - You can simply add your favorite songs to “**My star list**” by holding down  during playing music (max 100).

Use keys to manage the Multimedia player:

- : Set the volume level
- : Go to previous/next title (short keypress)

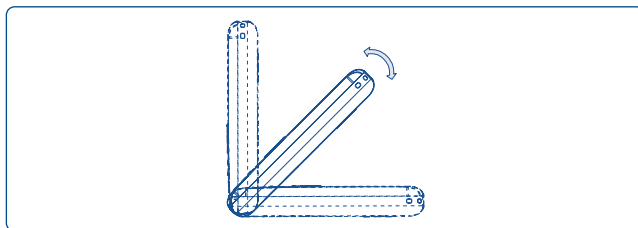

**14.3 FM Radio**

Your phone is equipped with an FM Radio <sup>(1)</sup> with RDS functionality. You can use the application as a traditional FM radio and saved channels or with parallel visual information related to the radio program on the display, if you tune to stations that offer Visual Radio service. You can listen to it while running other applications.



To use it, you must plug in your headset, which works as an antenna connected with your phone.

## 20 Troubleshooting .....

Before contacting the aftersales department, you are advised to follow the instructions below:

- You are advised to switch off the telephone from time to time to optimise its performance.
- You are advised to fully charge (  ) the battery for optimal operation.
- Avoid storing large amounts of data in your telephone as this may affect the performance of your telephone.

and carry out the following checks:

### **My mobile phone will not switch on**

- Press  until the screen comes on
- Check the battery charge level
- Check the battery contacts, remove and reinstall your battery, then turn your telephone back on

### **My phone has not responded for several minutes**

- Press the  key
- Remove the battery and re-insert it, then switch the phone back on

### **My screen is difficult to read**

- Clean your screen
- Use your mobile phone in accordance with the recommended conditions of use

### **My mobile phone turns off by itself**

- Check that your keypad is locked when you are not using your mobile phone
- Check the battery charge level

**My mobile phone has a low level of autonomy**

- Make sure you respected the complete charge timing (minimum 3 hours)
- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact. Wait for at least 20 minutes after removing the charger to obtain an exact indication

**My mobile phone will not charge properly**

- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; the battery charge indicator can take several minutes and may be accompanied by a quiet whistling sound
- Make sure charging is carried out under normal conditions (0°C +40°C)
- Make sure your battery is inserted. It must be inserted before plugging in the charger

**My callers are unable to leave messages on my voicemail**

- Contact your network operator to obtain the PUK code (Personal Unblocking Key)

**I am unable to connect my telephone to my computer**

- Install first of all Alcatel's PC suite
- Use "Install the connection" and perform the installation
- Check that your computer meets the requirements for Alcatel's PC Suite installation

**I am unable to download new files**

- Check for free space
- Delete some files
- Select the MicroSD Card to store the files you downloaded
- Check your subscription status with your operator

**The phone can't be detected by others via Bluetooth**

- Make sure that Bluetooth is turned on and your mobile phone is visible to other users (see page 45)
