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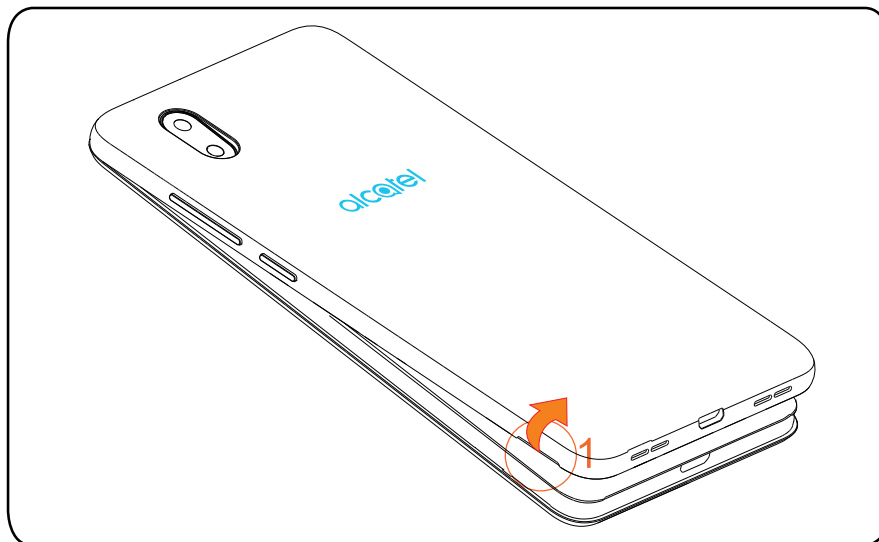
Getting started

Phone setup

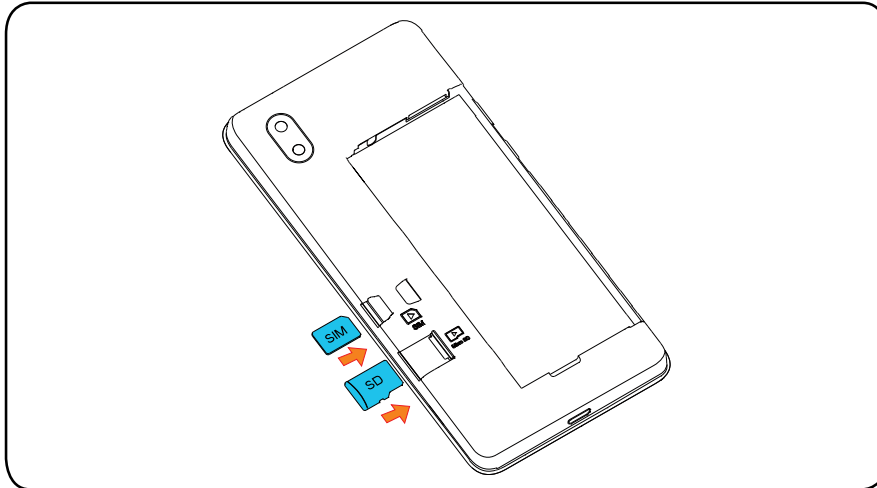
Installing the NANO SIM card

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. You do not need to power off your phone before inserting or removing the SIM card.

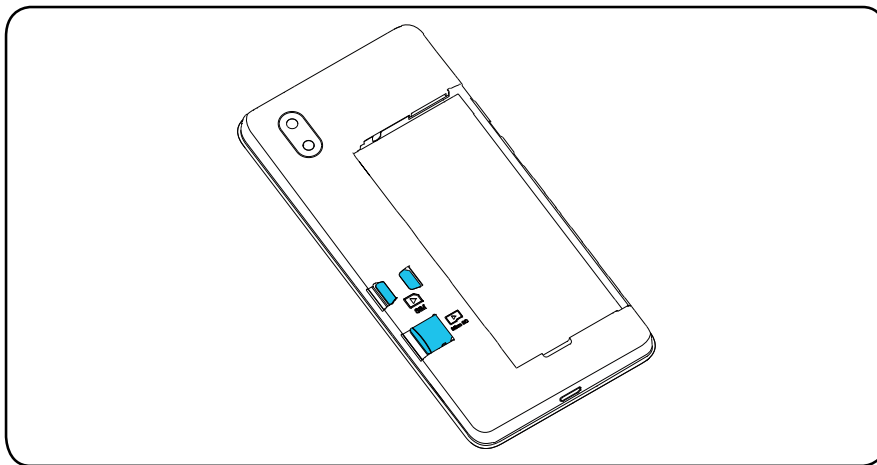
1. Remove the back cover by gently pulling up on the indentation on the bottom left of the cover.



2. Insert the SIM card and microSD™ card as shown in the illustration below.



3. Ensure that SIM and microSD™ cards have been properly secured.



Note: microSD™ card sold separately.

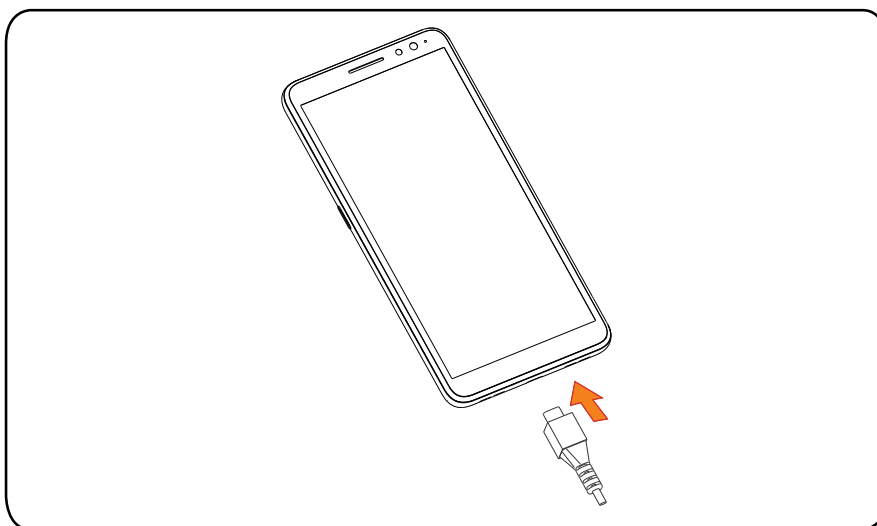
WARNING: To avoid damage to the phone, only use the standard NANO SIM card provided by your service provider.

Charging the battery

Your phone's battery should have enough power for the phone to power on, acquire a signal, and place several calls. You should fully charge the battery as soon as possible.

When the battery is low, a low-battery warning icon  will appear on the screen.

If the battery is extremely low, you may be unable to power on the phone even when it is being charged. In this case, try again after charging the phone for at least 10 minutes.



1. Insert the charger's connector into the charging port. Be sure to insert the connector in the correct orientation. Do not force the connector into the port.
2. Plug the charger into a standard AC wall outlet.
3. When the battery is fully charged, unplug the charger and disconnect it from the phone.

WARNING: Only use Alcatel-approved chargers and cables. The use of unapproved accessories could damage your phone.

Extending the battery life

Active applications, screen brightness levels, Bluetooth and Wi-Fi usage, and GPS functionality can drain your battery. Follow the helpful tips below to conserve your battery power:

- Reduce the time before the Sleep Mode function is activated.
- Lower the screen brightness.
- Turn auto-sync, Wi-Fi, and Bluetooth off when not in use.
- Disable the GPS function when not in use. Most applications using this function will periodically locate the GPS satellites for your current location.

Powering your phone on/off

Ensure that the NANO SIM card is in your phone and the battery is charged.

- Press and hold the **Power** key to power on your phone.
- To power it off, press and hold the **Power** key to open the options menu. Tap **Power off**.

Setting up your phone for the first time

Follow the steps below to set up your phone for the first time or after a factory reset:

1. Tap the language field to select the language you want to use and then tap **START**.
2. Connect to a secure and trusted Wi-Fi network, enter the password, and tap **CONNECT**. To skip, tap **SKIP** and tap **CONTINUE** on the pop-up message.
3. You will be prompted to agree to or decline Google Services, such as location and device maintenance, and to read Google's Terms of Service. Make your allowances and tap **ACCEPT** to continue.
4. Choose a screen lock type Pattern, PIN or Password to prevent others from using your phone.

Switching to Sleep Mode

To save battery power, Sleep Mode suspends your phone in a low-power-consumption state while the display is off. Your phone also goes into Sleep Mode by itself when the display is automatically turned off after a certain period of time, which you can set by tapping **Settings > Display > Sleep**.

Press the **Power** key to enable Sleep Mode.

Waking up your phone

Press the **Power** key to activate your screen display.

Note: You will need to enter your unlock method, if enabled, to unlock your screen (see Settings > Security > Screen lock).

Getting around

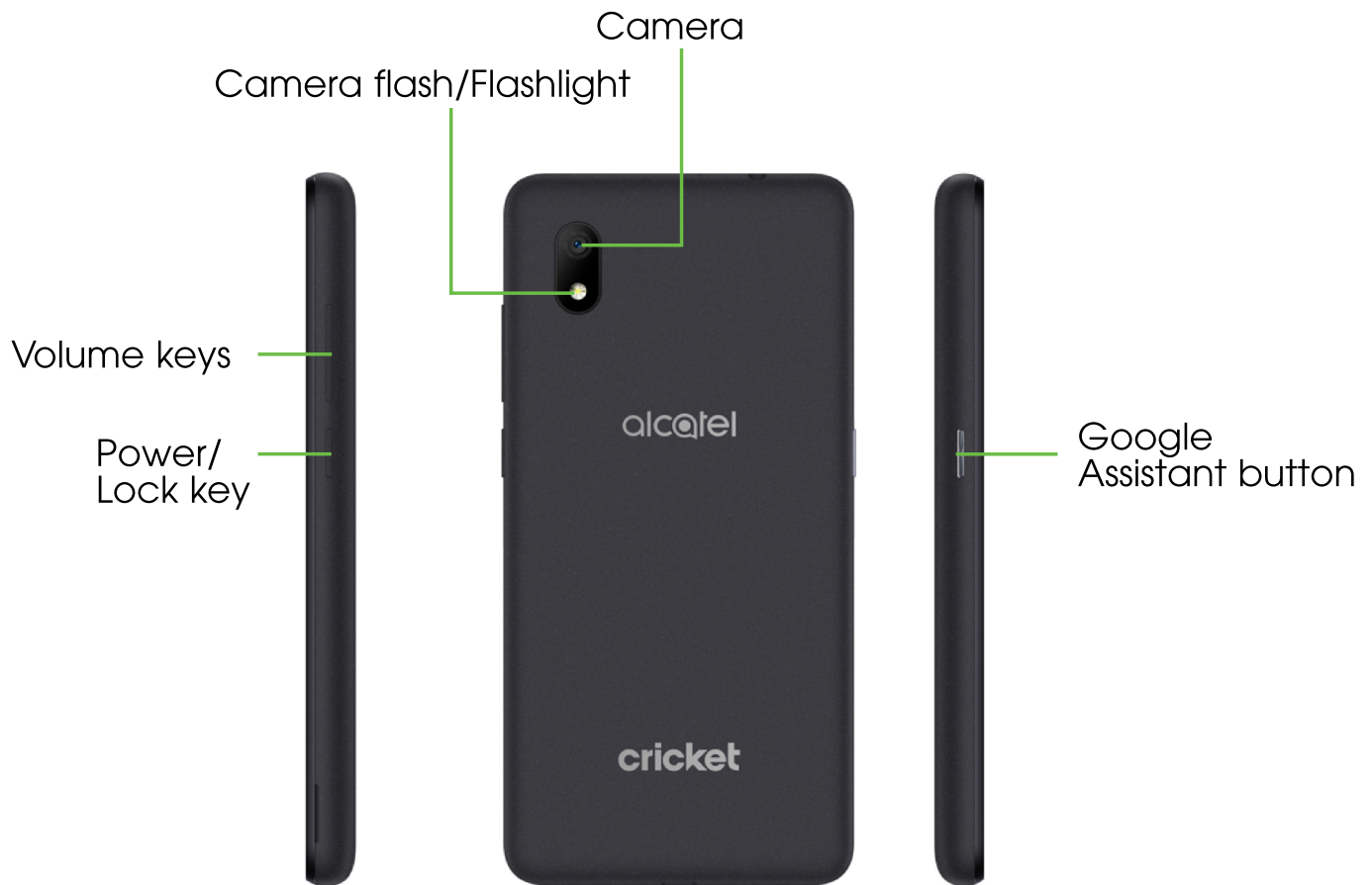
Touch control

Your phone's touch screen allows you to control actions through a variety of touch gestures.

- **Tap:** Tap the buttons, icons, or applications to select items or to open applications.
- **Press and hold:** To open the available options for an item (such as a message or link in a web page), press and hold the item.
- **Swipe or slide:** To scroll or toggle, quickly drag your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen.
- **Drag:** To drag, press and hold before you start to move your finger. While dragging, do not release your finger until you have reached the target position.
- **Pinch:** In some apps (such as Maps Go, Browser, and Photos), you can zoom by placing two fingers on the screen and pinching them together (to zoom out) or spreading them apart (to zoom in).
- **Rotate the screen:** In certain applications, you can change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways.

Getting to know your phone





Key functions



Recent apps

- Tap to switch between apps and files you've recently opened.



Home

- From any application or screen, tap to return to the Home screen.
- Press and hold to activate your Google Assistant.



Back

- Tap to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialog box, options menu, the Notifications panel, etc.



Power/Lock key

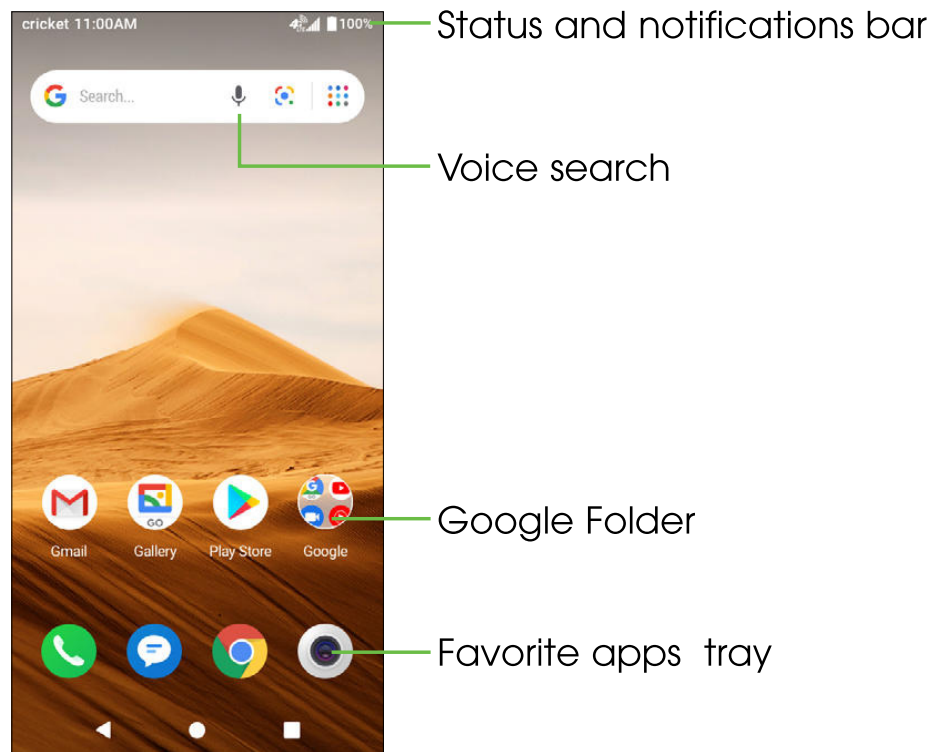
- Press: Lock the screen/Light up the screen.
- Press and hold: Show the popup menu to select from Power off/Restart/Screenshot/Airplane mode.
- Press and hold the Power key and Volume down key to capture a screenshot.
- Press and hold the Power key for at least 10 seconds to force restart.



Volume Keys

- Adjust the earpiece or headset volume during a phone call.
- Adjusts the media volume while listening to music or a video, or streaming content.
- Adjust the ringtone volume.
- Mute the ringtone of an incoming call.
- While using the Camera app, press Volume up or down key to take a photo or press and hold to take several photos.

Customize your Home screen by adding application shortcuts, widgets, folders, and using wallpapers.



Extended home screen

In addition to the main home screen, your phone has extended home screens to provide more space for adding apps, widgets, and more. Once an app or widget is added to the extended home screen, swipe your finger to the left or right to access the extended home screen panels.

Adding items to your home screen

- To add an app to your home screen, swipe up on the home screen to access all the applications on the phone. Press and hold the desired app, and drag it to the home screen.

Choosing your wallpaper

1. Press and hold an empty place on the home screen and tap **WALLPAPERS**.
2. Tap a wallpaper and tap **Set wallpaper**. You can also tap **My photos** to use a photo as your wallpaper.
3. A popup menu will appear to set the selected wallpaper as image for the Home screen, Lock screen, or both.

Organizing apps with a folder

1. Hold and drag an application over another to create folders.
2. To add more shortcuts into the folder, press and hold each shortcut and drag them over the folder before releasing them.

Removing items from your home screen

1. Press and hold the item you want to delete until **X Remove** appears at the top of the screen.
2. Drag the item to **X Remove** and release your finger when the item turns red.

Viewing your apps

Swipe up on the home screen to access all the applications on the phone. You can add apps to your home screen and uninstall or disable them.

Uninstall or disable an application

1. Swipe up on the home screen.
2. Press and hold an application.
3. To uninstall an app, drag it to **X Remove** and release it.
4. To enable or disable an application, swipe up on the home screen > **Settings > Apps & notifications > App info**, then select the app.

Note: Not all applications can be uninstalled or disabled.

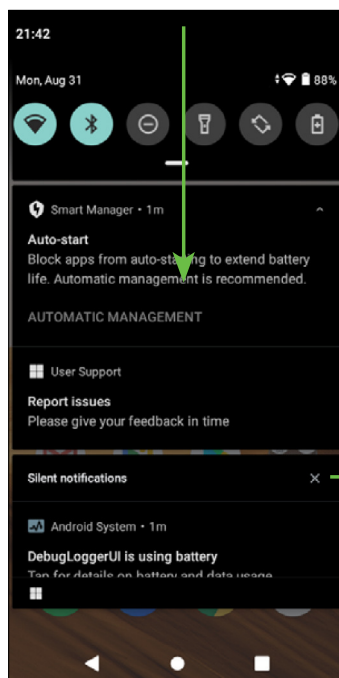

Using the Notifications panel

Drag down from the Status bar to open the Notifications panel. Drag down once again to enter the Quick settings panel. When there are notifications, you can tap them to access notifications directly.

Notifications panel

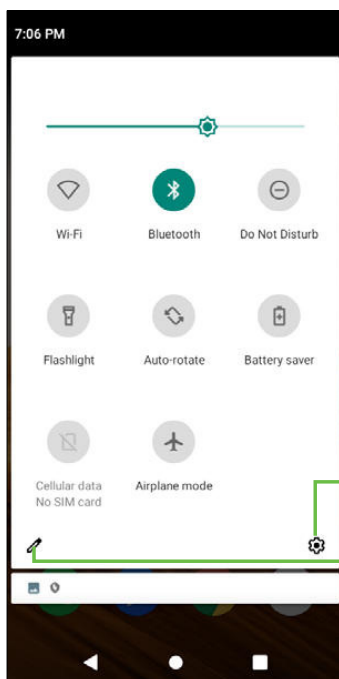
When there are notifications, drag down from the Status bar to open the Notifications panel to read more detailed information.



Clear new notifications (ongoing notifications, such as New Voicemail, will remain)

Quick settings panel

Drag down the Notifications panel to open the Quick settings panel. This will allow you to access frequently used settings like Wi-Fi, screen brightness, airplane mode, and others. You can open this panel from anywhere on your device, including your lock screen.



Tap to access **Settings**, where you can set more items.

Tap **EDIT** to customize your Quick settings panel.

Secure your phone

Enable an unlock method to keep your phone secure. Select Swipe, Pattern, PIN, Password, or Face Unlock *.

1. Swipe up on the home screen > **Settings > Security > Screen lock.**
2. Tap **Swipe, Pattern, PIN, or Password.**
 - Tap **None** to disable screen lock.
 - Tap **Swipe** to enable screen lock.

Note: you will not need a pattern, PIN, password to access the phone

- Tap **Pattern** to create a pattern you must draw to unlock the screen.
- Tap **PIN** or **Password** to set a numeric PIN or a password that you must enter to unlock your screen.

You can also enable Face Unlock*. Face Unlock will unlock your phone by using the front camera to register your face.

1. For the best result, start the setup in a bright, indoor environment away from direct sunlight.
2. Hold your phone about 20-50 cm from your face.
3. Position your face in the square shown on the screen, then select Continue when registration is complete.

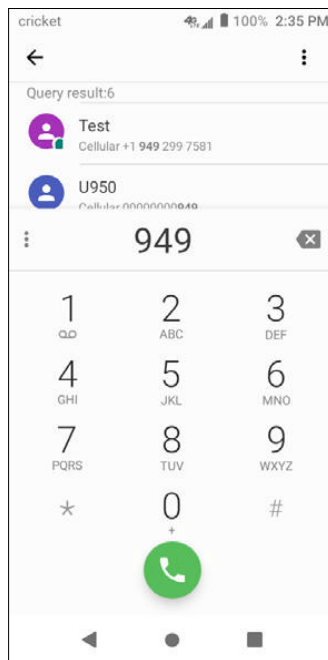
* Facial Recognition may not be as secure as Pattern, PIN, or Password locks. We may use Facial Recognition methods only for the purpose to unlock the phone. The data collected from you through such methods will be stored in your device and will not be disclosed to any third-party. You may delete your data anytime by visiting Settings > Security > Face Unlock > Remove face data.

Phone calls

Making calls

Calling from the dial pad

1. From the home screen, tap .
2. Tap  to open the dial pad.



3. Enter the phone number with the on-screen keypad. Tap  to delete incorrect digits.

Note: As you enter digits, your phone searches for contacts that match. If you see the number you want to dial, tap it to place the call immediately without entering the rest of the number.

4. Tap  to place the call.

Tip: To make an international call, press and hold the 0 key to enter the plus (+) symbol. Next, enter the country code, followed by the area code, and then the phone number.

Dial a Recent Number

1. From the home screen, tap  > .

2. Swipe the screen up or down and tap the contact you want to call.

Tip: You can search for a contact by tapping the search field at the top of the screen.

3. Tap the number or contact name, then tap  to call, or tap the number to call.

Calling from Contacts

1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap .

2. Swipe your finger up or down to scroll through the contacts list, tap the contact you want to call, then tap  to call.

Tip: You can search for a contact by tapping the search field above the Contact lists.

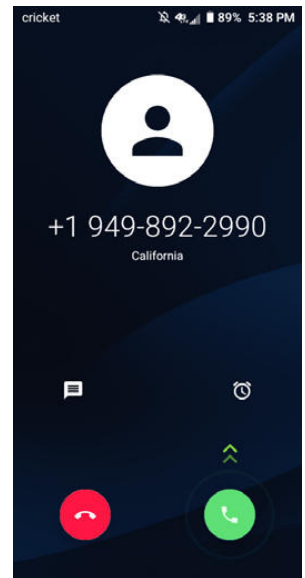
Calling from Messaging

1. From Messaging  tap the conversation with the contact you wish to call.

2. Tap  at the top of the screen to call that number.

Receiving calls

- Press  and swipe up to answer an incoming phone call.
- Press  and swipe up to reject an incoming phone call.
- Tap  to set a reminder to call the number back in 5 or 10 minutes.
- Tap  to reject the call and select a preset test message to send to the caller.



Using options during a call

During a call, you will see a number of on-screen options. Tap an option to select it.

- Tap  to turn the speaker on or off.
- Tap  to mute or unmute your microphone.
- Tap  to open the dial pad.
- Tap  to put the call on hold.
- Tap  to place a second call, separate from the first call, which is put on hold. You can then merge  the calls to create a conference call.
- Tap  to end the current call.

WARNING: Do not place the phone near your ear while the speakerphone is in use.

Managing multi-party calls

When call waiting and three-way calling features are available, you can switch between two calls or set up a conference call.

Note: Call waiting and three-way call features require network support and may result in additional charges. Please contact your service provider for more information.

Switching between current calls

When you're on a call, your phone will vibrate or a your notification ringtone will sound to inform you that another call is coming in. The screen will display the caller ID.

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

Press  and swipe up to answer the call. This puts the first call on hold and answers the second call. Press  and swipe up to reject the second call.

Note: Tap  to reject the second call and select a preset text message to the caller.

To switch between two calls:

Tap  or **On hold** on the screen.

Setting up a conference call

1. In the dial pad, enter a number and tap .
2. Once you have established the connection, tap  >  and dial the second number. This puts the first caller on hold and dials the second number.
3. When you're connected to the second party, tap .

If one of the individuals on the line hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all callers are disconnected.

To end the conference call, tap .

Adjusting your phone settings

From the home screen, tap  >  > **Settings** to configure the phone options.

PHONE SETTINGS

Quick responses: Edit quick responses which will be used when you reject a call with messages.

Dial pad tones: Enable playing tones when using the dial pad.

Call settings

- **Voicemail**

Access voicemail service and number settings.

- **Wi-Fi calling**

Turn on/off Wi-Fi calling to allow your device to make calls over a Wi-Fi network.

- **Call forwarding**

Configure how your calls are forwarded when unanswered.

- **Additional settings**

Use default carrier settings to display your number in outgoing calls.

Accessibility

- **Teletypewriter (TTY) Call Button**

TTY assists callers who are deaf, hard of hearing, have a speech disability, or need more than voice alone. Incoming/outgoing speech can be converted to a teletypewriter messaging when TTY call has been established.

- **Hearing aids**

Enable hearing aid compatibility.

- **Noise reduction**

Suppress your background noise during calls.

Quick dial: Assign specific numbers to numbers on your dial pad for quick dialing.

CONTACTS SETTINGS

Import/Export: Import or export contacts between phone, SIM card, microSD™ card and phone storage.

Merge contacts: Select duplicate contacts to merge.

Manage account: Manage the synchronization settings for different accounts.

Display options

- **Sort by**

Set the contacts display by First name or Last name.

- **Name format**

Set the name format by First name first or Last name first.

Contacts

Add contacts on your phone and synchronize them with the contacts in your Google account or other accounts that support contact syncing.

To see your contacts, swipe up on the home screen >  contacts.

Importing and exporting contacts

Import/export contacts from/to your NANO SIM card, phone storage, Gmail account, or microSD™ card. This is especially useful when you need to transfer contacts between different devices. You can also quickly share your contacts using Bluetooth, Gmail, Messaging, and other applications.

1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap .
2. Tap  > **Settings** > **Import/Export**, select the account to copy contacts from (**Phone, SIM card, Gmail account, or microSD™ card**), and tap **NEXT** to choose where the contacts are copied.

To import/export a single contact from/to your SIM card, select the contact you want to import/export and tap the  icon to confirm.

To import/export all contacts from/to your SIM card, tap the icon  and then the  icon to confirm.

Sharing contact information

Share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc.

1. From the Contacts screen, tap the contact you want to share, tap  > **Share**.
2. Use the pop-up menu to choose how to share the contact information. Available options will depend on the applications and services installed.

Creating a contact

1. From the Contacts screen, tap  to add a new contact.
2. Tap the account field near the top of the screen to choose where to save the contact. If a sync account is selected, the contacts will be synced automatically with your account online.
3. Enter the contact name, phone numbers, email addresses, and other information.
4. Tap  to save the contact.

Adding a contact to Favorites

Add the contacts you use frequently to Favorites so that you can find them quickly.

1. From the Contacts screen, tap the contact you want to add to Favorites.
2. Tap .

Searching for a contact

1. Tap  above the contacts list.

2. Enter the contact name, phone number or email address you want to find.
Matching contacts will be listed.

Linking contacts

As your phone synchronizes with multiple online accounts, you may see duplicate entries for the same contact. You can merge all the separate information of a contact into one entry in the Contacts list.

1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap .
2. Tap a contact to display the contact's details.
3. Tap  > **Link**.
4. Tap the contact whose information you want to merge with the first entry.

The information from the second contact is added to the first, and the second contact is no longer displayed in the contacts list.

Unlinking contacts

If contact information from different sources was merged in error, restore the information to individual contacts on your phone.

1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap .
2. Tap a contact you have merged and want to separate.
3. Tap  > **View linked contacts** > **SEPARATE**

Messaging

Use Messaging to exchange text messages (SMS) and multimedia messages (MMS).

Opening the messaging screen

From the home screen, tap .

The Messaging screen opens, where you can create a new message, search for messages, or open an ongoing message thread.

- Tap  to write a new text or multimedia message.
- Tap  to search for keywords within a message.
- Tap an existing message thread to open the conversation with a contact, phone number, or email address.

Sending a message

1. From the Messaging screen, tap  at the bottom of the screen.
2. Add recipients by one of the following ways:
 - Tap the **To** field and type the recipient's name, number, or email address. If the recipient is saved in Contacts, their contact information will appear.
 - Tap  **Dialpad** to enter a number not saved in contacts, or without searching Contacts .
3. Tap the **Add text** field and enter the content of your text message.
4. If you want to send a multimedia message, tap the paper clip icon  to attach a file to the message.

5. Tap  to send your message.

Note: Messages sent to email addresses are multimedia messages.

Replying to a message

Messages you receive are added to existing conversation threads with the same recipient. If the new message comes from a new number, a new thread is created.

1. From the Messaging screen, tap the thread that has the message you want to reply to.
2. Type your reply in the text box at the bottom. You can tap  if you want to reply with an MMS.
3. Tap  to send your message.

Forwarding a message

1. From the thread screen, press and hold a message you want to forward.
2. Tap .
3. Enter a recipient for the message and edit the content if you want.
4. Tap  to send your message.

Changing message settings

The phone's message settings are pre-configured for you to use immediately. To change them, tap  > **Settings** from the Messaging screen.

Email

Swipe up on the home screen, tap  **Gmail**. Receive and send emails from your webmail or other accounts using POP3 or IMAP, or access your Exchange ActiveSync account for your corporate email needs.

Setting up the first email account

1. From the Home screen, tap  **Gmail**.
2. Enter your email address and tap **NEXT** and enter your password and then tap **NEXT** again.
3. Confirm email account settings, tap **NEXT**.
4. Enter your name which will be displayed on outgoing emails, tap **NEXT**.

Note: You can also enter these details manually by tapping **MANUAL SETUP**.

Checking your emails

Your phone can automatically check for new emails at the interval you set when setting up the account.

When you are in an email account, swipe down on the screen to download new emails.

Responding to an email

Reply to or forward a message that you receive. You can also delete messages and manage them in other ways.

Replying to or forwarding an email

1. Open the email you want to reply to or forward.
2. Choose from the following:
 - To reply to the sender, tap .
 - To reply to the sender and all recipients of the original email, tap  **Reply all** or tap the **Reply all** button on the keyboard.
 - To forward the email to someone else, tap .
3. Edit your message and tap  to send.

Deleting an email

You can delete a single email or several emails at once.

- With an email message open, tap .
- While in an email list (such as inbox), tap the checkboxes next to the messages and then tap .

Writing and sending an email

1. Open your email Inbox and tap .

Note: If you have more than one email account added on the phone, tap the sender line to select the account you want to use for sending the message.

2. Enter a contact name or email address in the **To** field. Separate each recipient with a comma.

Note: Tap  > **Cc/Bcc** to Cc or Bcc other recipients.

3. Enter the email subject and compose the email text.
4. Tap  to add audio files, images, videos, and other types of files as an attachment.
5. Tap  to send the message.

Adding and editing email accounts

Adding an email account

After setting up your first email account (see *Email – Setting up the first email account*), you can add more email accounts and manage them separately.

1. Open **Gmail** to get to the Inbox screen.
2. Tap  > **Settings** and tap **Add account**.
3. Follow the prompts to set up your second account.

Editing an email account

Change a number of settings for an account, including how often you check for email, how you're notified of new emails, your email signature, and details about the servers the account uses to send and receive email.

1. Open **Gmail** to access your inbox.
2. Tap  > **Settings** and tap the account you want to change.
3. Make the changes and tap  when you're finished.

Changing general email settings

1. General settings apply to all email accounts you add.
2. Open **Gmail** to get the Inbox screen.
3. Tap  > **Settings** > **General settings**.
4. Make the changes and tap  when you're finished.

Connecting to the Internet

Your phone's impressive networking capabilities allow you to access the Internet or your corporate network with ease. You can use default connection settings to connect to the Web via your cellular network or Wi-Fi. The mobile data connection can be enabled/disabled manually. Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Network & internet > Cellular network** and enable/disable **Cellular Data**.

Turning on Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that provides internet access.

1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Network & internet > Wi-Fi**.
2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the  position to turn on Wi-Fi.

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Network & internet > Wi-Fi**. Available Wi-Fi networks and hotspots are displayed with network names and security settings.
2. Tap an network name to connect to it. If security features are implemented, you'll need to enter a password.

Note: Your phone automatically connects to previously used Wi-Fi networks when that network is in range.

Adding a Wi-Fi network

Add a Wi-Fi network if the network does not broadcast its name (SSID), or to add a Wi-Fi network when you are out of range.

To connect to a secure network, you first need to get the security details from the network's administrator.

1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Network & internet > Wi-Fi**.
2. Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the  position.
3. Tap **Add network**.
4. Enter the network SSID (name). If necessary, enter security or other network configuration details.
5. Tap **SAVE**.

Checking the Wi-Fi network status

Check the Wi-Fi network by looking at the  icon in the status bar. Or tap the network name that the phone is currently connected to in the Wi-Fi screen. You can then check the network status from the pop-up window.

Note: A shortcut to the Wi-Fi status and settings is available in the Quick Settings Menu. From the top of the screen, swipe down once to access the Quick Settings menu. Tap  to turn Wi-Fi on/off. Press and hold  to open the Wi-Fi menu.

Connecting to virtual private networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions to let people access local network resources when not on campus, or when connected to a wireless network.

Depending on the type of VPN you are using, you may be required to enter your login credentials or install security certificates before you can connect to your VPN. You can get this information from your network administrator.

Adding a VPN

1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Network & internet > VPN**.
2. Tap  and fill in the information provided by your network administrator.
3. Tap **SAVE**.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN screen.

Connecting to a VPN

1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Network & internet > VPN**.
2. Tap the VPN that you want to connect.
3. When prompted, enter any requested credentials, and then tap **CONNECT**.

When you are connected, the VPN connected icon  appears in the Status bar.

Modifying a VPN

1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Network & internet > VPN**.
2. Press and hold the VPN that you want to modify.
3. Tap **Edit** profile and edit the VPN settings you want.
4. Tap **SAVE**.

Browsing the Internet

Use **Chrome** to view web pages and search for information.

Opening a webpage or searching the web

1. From the home screen, tap  **Chrome**.
2. Tap the address box at the top of the web page. If the address box isn't visible, scroll to the top of the webpage.
3. Enter the address (URL) of a webpage, or enter terms to conduct a Google Search.
4. Tap a URL to open the web page, or tap the search suggestion to open the search results.
5. To go back a page, tap . To go forward, tap .

Tips:

- Tap  >  to stop opening the page.
- Tap  >  to refresh the page.
- Tap  at the top of a web page to add a bookmark.

Using multiple browser tabs

Open several web pages at the same time (one page in each tab) and switch between them freely.

Opening a new browser tab

Tap  > . A new browser window opens and the homepage is loaded.

Switching between tabs

Tap  > to view and switch between tabs.

Tip: Tap  to close the tab.

Setting the home page

Your home page opens whenever you launch your browser or open a new tab.

1. Open the page you want to set as your home page.
2. Tap  > **Settings** > **Home page**.
3. Tap **Open this page**, enter the address (URL) and tap **Save**.

Downloading files

1. Press and hold an image or a link to a file or to another web page.
2. In the menu that opens, tap **Download image** or **Download link**.

Note: The downloaded files are saved to your phone or the microSD™ card.
You can view or open the downloaded files by **swiping up on the home screen** > **Downloads**.

Changing browser settings

Configure a number of browser settings to customize the way you browse the web, including several you can use to control your privacy.

To open the browser settings screen, tap  > **Settings** in the web page screen.

Mobile Hotspot & Tethering

Share your phone's mobile data connection with a single computer via a USB cable (USB tethering) or with up to ten devices at once (wirelessly) by turning your phone into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot.

Warning: The functions below may incur additional network charges from your network carrier. Extra fees may also be charged in roaming areas.

Share your phone's data connection via USB

Use the USB cable that came with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer.

1. Tap **Settings > Network & internet > Tethering & portable hotspot > Mobile hotspot**.
2. Toggle the **USB tethering** switch to activate/deactivate this function.

Share your phone's data connection as a portable Wi-Fi hotspot

1. Tap **Settings > Network & internet > Tethering & portable hotspot**.
2. Toggle the **Mobile Hotspot** tethering switch to enable/disable this function.

Rename or secure your portable Wi-Fi hotspot

When Mobile Hotspot is activated, you can change the name of your phone's Wi-Fi network (SSID) and secure its Wi-Fi network.

- Tap **Settings > Network & internet > Tethering & portable hotspot > Mobile hotspot** to change the network SSID or set your network security.

Using Wi-Fi Direct

Wi-Fi Direct allows two devices to establish a direct, peer-to-peer Wi-Fi connection without requiring a wireless router.

Connecting to another device via Wi-Fi Direct

1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Network & internet > Wi-Fi**.
2. If Wi-Fi is off, slide the Wi-Fi switch to the  position.
3. Tap **Wi-Fi preferences > Advanced > Wi-Fi Direct**. Your phone will search for other devices enabled with Wi-Fi Direct connections.
4. Tap a device name under Peer Devices to connect with it. The other device will receive a Wi-Fi Direct connection prompt and need to accept the request for connection. If prompted, tap **ACCEPT**.
5. Once connected, the device is displayed as "Connected".

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology. Phones or other devices with Bluetooth capabilities can exchange information wirelessly. The Bluetooth devices must be paired before the communication is performed.

Turning Bluetooth on/off

1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Connected devices > Connection preferences > Bluetooth**.
2. Tap the Bluetooth switch to  enable or  disable Bluetooth. Turning Bluetooth on will make your phone visible to nearby devices.

Note: A shortcut to the Bluetooth status and settings is available in the Quick Settings Menu. From the top of the screen, swipe down once to access the Quick Settings menu. Tap  to turn Bluetooth on/off. Press and hold  to open the Bluetooth menu.

Changing the device name

1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Connected devices > Connection preferences > Bluetooth**.
2. Slide the Bluetooth switch to the  position if Bluetooth is off.
3. Tap **Device name > Rename this device**.
4. Edit the name and tap **RENAME**.

Pairing with another Bluetooth device

1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Connected devices > Connection preferences > Bluetooth**.
2. Slide the Bluetooth switch to the  position if Bluetooth is off. Tap **Pair new device** to display a list of available devices.
3. Tap the name of the device to initiate pairing.
4. Confirm that the Bluetooth passkeys are the same between the two devices and tap **PAIR**. Alternately, enter a Bluetooth passkey and tap **PAIR**. Pairing is successfully completed when the other device accepts the connection or the same passkey is entered.

Note: The Bluetooth passkey may be fixed for certain devices, such as headsets and hands-free car kits. You can try entering 0000 or 1234 (the most common passkeys), or refer to the documents for that device.

Unpairing from a Bluetooth device

You can make your phone forget its pairing connection with another Bluetooth device. To connect to the device again, you may need to enter or confirm a passkey again.

1. Swipe up on the home screen, tap **Settings > Connected devices** and make sure Bluetooth is turned on.
2. In the list of paired devices, tap  beside the Bluetooth device you want to unpair.
3. Tap **FORGET**.

Sending data via Bluetooth

1. Open the appropriate application and select the file or item you want to share.
2. Select the option for sharing via Bluetooth. The method may vary by application and data type.
3. Tap a Bluetooth device the phone has paired with or wait for it to search for new devices and tap one of them.

Receiving data via Bluetooth

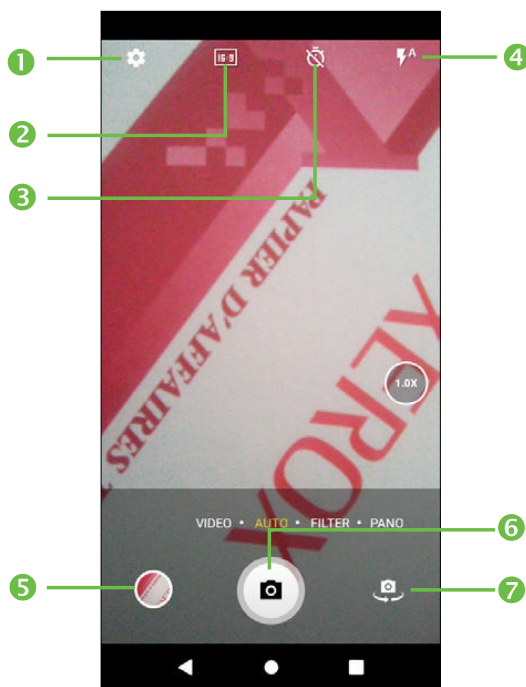
1. Turn Bluetooth on before trying to receive data via Bluetooth.
Note: If the phone has not been paired with the sending device, you may need to tap your phone's device name in the Bluetooth menu in Settings to keep the phone detectable through Bluetooth.
2. Swipe down on the status bar and tap **accept**.
3. **ACCEPT** to start receiving the data.

Entertainment

You can use your phone to take photos and record videos. Photos and videos are stored to the phone's internal storage or microSD™ card (if applicable). You can copy them to your computer or access them in  Photos.

Capturing a photo

1. From the home screen, tap  **Camera**.
2. Aim the camera at the subject and make any necessary adjustments.

 4. Tap  to start recording.
 5. Tap  to stop recording.
- Tip:** While the recording is in progress, you can tap  to save the frame as a separate photo.

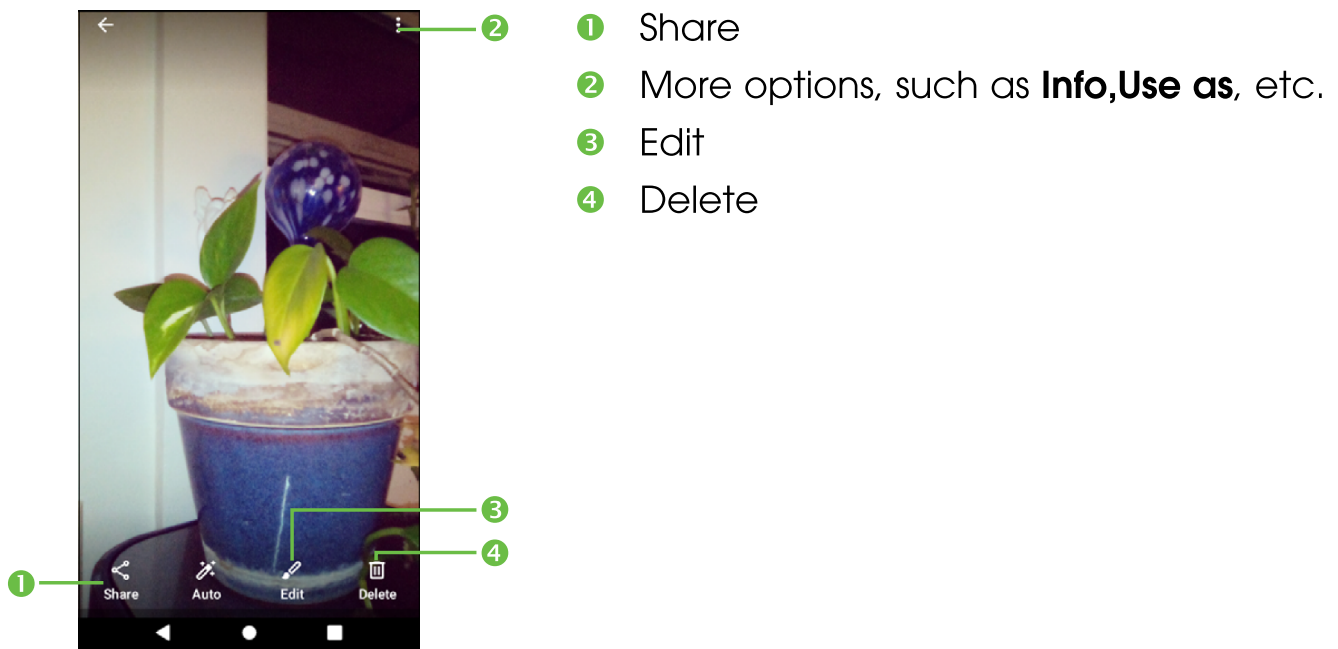

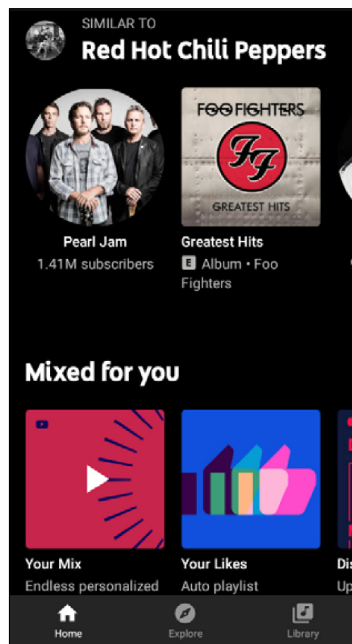

FCC RF Exposure Information (SAR)

This phone is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the United States.

During SAR testing, this device was set to transmit at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands and placed in positions that simulate RF exposure in usage against the head with no separation, and near the body with the separation of 15 mm. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the device while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

The exposure standard for wireless devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6 W/kg.

Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. SAR information on this model phone is on file with the FCC and can be found under the Display Grant section of www.fcc.gov/oet/ea/fccid after searching on FCC ID: 2AC CJH124.

For this device, the highest reported SAR value for usage against the head is 0.95 W/kg, for usage near the body is 1.30 W/kg.

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirements.

SAR compliance for body-worn operation is based on a separation distance of 15 mm between the unit and the human body. Carry this device at least 15 mm away from your body to ensure RF exposure level compliant or lower to the reported level. To support body-worn operation, choose the belt clips or holsters, which do not contain metallic components, to maintain a separation of 15 mm between this device and your body.

RF exposure compliance with any body-worn accessory, which contains metal, was not tested and certified, and use such body-worn accessory should be avoided.

Hearing Aid Compatibility (HAC) regulations for mobile phones

In 2003, the FCC adopted rules to make digital wireless telephones compatible with hearing aids and cochlear implants. Although analog wireless phones do not usually cause interference with hearing aids or cochlear implants, digital wireless phones sometimes do because of electromagnetic energy emitted by the phone's antenna, backlight, or other components. Your phone is compliant with FCC HAC regulations (ANSI C63.19- 2011). While some wireless phones are used near some hearing devices (hearing aids and cochlear implants), users may detect a buzzing, humming, or whining noise. Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise and phones also vary in the amount of interference they generate. The wireless telephone industry has developed a rating system for wireless phones to assist hearing device users in finding phones that may be compatible with their hearing devices. Not all phones have been rated. Phones that are rated have the rating on their box or a label located on the box. The ratings are not guarantees. Trying out the phone with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.

This phone has been tested and rated for use with hearing aids for some of the wireless technologies that it uses. However, there may be some newer wireless technologies used in this phone that have not been tested yet for use with hearing aids. It is important to try the different features of this phone thoroughly and in different locations, using your hearing aid or cochlear implant, to determine if you hear any interfering noise. Consult your service provider or the manufacturer of this phone for more information on hearing aid compatibility. If you have questions about return or exchange policies, consult your service provider or phone retailer.

M-Ratings: Phones rated M3 or M4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than phones that are not labeled. M4 is the better/higher of the two ratings.

T-Ratings: Phones rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to be more usable with a hearing device's telecoil ("T Switch" or "Telephone Switch") than unrated phones. T4 is the better/ higher of the two ratings. (Note that not all hearing devices have telecoils in them.)

Your phone meets the M4/T3 level rating.

Distraction

Driving

Operating machinery

Full attention must be given to operating the machinery in order to reduce the risk of an accident.

Product handling

General statement on handling and use

You alone are responsible for how you use your phone and any consequences of its use.

You must always power off your phone wherever the use of a phone is prohibited. Use of your phone is subject to safety measures designed to protect users and their environment.

- Always treat your phone and its accessories with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.
- Do not expose your phone or its accessories to open flames or lit tobacco products.
- Do not expose your phone or its accessories to liquid, moisture, or high humidity.

- Do not drop, throw, or try to bend your phone or its accessories.
- Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or aerosols to clean the device or its accessories.
- Do not paint your phone or its accessories.
- Do not attempt to disassemble your phone or its accessories. Only authorized personnel can do so.
- Do not expose your phone or its accessories to extreme temperatures, minimum 32°F and maximum 122°F (minimum 0°C and maximum + 50°C).
- Please check local regulations for disposal of electronic products.
- Do not carry your phone in your back pocket as it could break when you sit down.

Small children

Do not leave your phone and its accessories within the reach of small children or allow them to play with it. They could hurt themselves or others, or could accidentally damage the phone.

Your phone contains small parts with sharp edges that may cause an injury or may become detached and create a choking hazard.

Demagnetization

To avoid the risk of demagnetization, do not allow electronic devices or magnetic media close to your phone for a long time.

Electrostatic discharge (ESD)

Do not touch the NANO SIM card's metal connectors.

Antenna

Do not touch the antenna unnecessarily.

Normal use position

When placing or receiving a phone call, hold your phone to your ear, with the bottom toward your mouth.

Air bags

Do not place a phone in the area over an air bag or in the air bag deployment area as an airbag inflates with great force and serious injury could result.

Store the phone safely before driving your vehicle.

Seizures/blackouts

The phone can produce a bright or flashing light. A small percentage of people may be susceptible to blackouts or seizures (even if they have never had one before) when exposed to flashing lights or light patterns such as when playing games or watching a video. If you have experienced seizures or blackouts or have a family history of such occurrences, please consult a physician.

Repetitive strain injuries

To minimize the risk of Repetitive Strain Injury (RSI) when texting or playing games with your phone:

- Do not grip the phone too tightly.
- Press the keys lightly.

- Use the special features that are designed to minimize the times of pressing buttons, such as Message Templates and Predictive Text.
- Take lots of breaks to stretch and relax.

Emergency calls

This phone, like any wireless phone, operates using radio signals, which cannot guarantee connection in all conditions. Therefore, you must never rely solely on any wireless phone for emergency communications.

Loud noise

This phone is capable of producing loud noises, which may damage your hearing. Turn down the volume before using headphones, Bluetooth stereo headsets or other audio devices.

Phone heating

Your phone may become warm during charging and during normal use.

Electrical safety

Accessories

Use only approved accessories.

Do not connect with incompatible products or accessories.

Take care not to touch or allow metal objects, such as coins or key rings, to contact or short-circuit in the battery terminals.

Connection to a car

Seek professional advice when connecting a phone interface to the vehicle electrical system.

Faulty and damaged products

Do not attempt to disassemble the phone or its accessories.

Only qualified personnel can service or repair the phone or its accessories.

If your phone (or its accessories) has been submerged in water, punctured, or subjected to a severe fall, do not use it until you have taken it to be checked at an authorized service center.

Interference

General statement on interference

Care must be taken when using the phone in close proximity to personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids.

Pacemakers

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 6 inches (15 cm) be maintained between a mobile phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. To achieve this, use the phone on the opposite ear to your pacemaker and do not carry it in a breast pocket.

Hearing aids

People with hearing aids or other cochlear implants may experience interference noise when using wireless devices or when one is nearby.

The level of interference will depend on the type of hearing device and the distance from the interference source, increasing the separation between them may reduce the interference. You may also consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Medical devices

Please consult your doctor and the device manufacturer to determine if using your phone may interfere with the operation of your medical device.

Hospitals

Switch off your wireless device when requested to do so in hospitals, clinics, or healthcare facilities. These requests are designed to prevent possible interference with sensitive medical equipment.

Aircraft

Switch off your wireless device whenever you are instructed to do so by airport or airline staff.

Consult the airline staff about the use of wireless devices on board the aircraft. If your device offers a 'flight mode', this must be enabled prior to boarding an aircraft.

Interference in cars

Please note that because of possible interference to electronic equipment, some vehicle manufacturers forbid the use of mobile phones in their vehicles unless a hands-free kit with an external antenna is included in the installation.

Explosive environments

Gas stations and explosive atmospheres

In locations with potentially explosive atmospheres, obey all posted signs to turn off wireless devices such as your phone or other radio equipment.

Areas with potentially explosive atmospheres include fueling areas, below decks on boats, fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities, and areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders.

Blasting caps and areas

Power off your mobile phone or wireless device when in a blasting area or in areas posted with power off “two-way radios” or “electronic devices” notices to avoid interfering with blasting operations.
