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safety and usage information

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your mobile phone.



Safety warnings

Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

Protect your hearing



Excessive exposure to sound at high volumes can cause hearing damage. Always turn the volume down before plugging the earphones into an audio source and use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

Install mobile phones and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone. Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.
- Never dispose of batteries or phones in a fire. Follow all local regulations when disposing of used batteries or phones.

- Never place batteries or phones on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated.
- Never crush or puncture the battery. Avoid exposing the battery to high external pressure, which can lead to an internal short circuit and overheating.

Avoid interference with pacemakers

Maintain a minimum of 15 cm (6 inches) between mobile phones and pacemakers to avoid potential interference, as recommended by manufacturers and the independent research group, Wireless Technology Research. If you have any reason to suspect that your phone is interfering with a pacemaker or other medical device, turn off the phone immediately and contact the manufacturer of the pacemaker or medical device for guidance.

Turn off the phone in potentially explosive environments

Do not use your phone at refuelling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals. Turn off your phone whenever directed by warning signs or instructions. Your phone could cause explosions or fire in and around fuel or chemical storage and transfer areas or blasting areas. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories.

Reduce the risk of repetitive motion injuries

While using your phone, hold the phone with a relaxed grip, press the keys lightly, use special features that reduce the number of keys you have to press (such as templates and predictive text), and take frequent breaks.

Do not use the phone if the screen is cracked or broken

Broken glass or acrylic could cause injury to your hand and face. Bring the phone to a Samsung service centre to replace the screen. Damage caused by careless handling will void your manufacturer's warranty.

Safety precautions

Drive safely at all times

Avoid using your phone while driving and obey all regulations that restrict the use of mobile phones while driving. Use hands-free accessories to increase your safety when possible.

Follow all safety warnings and regulations

Comply with any regulations that restrict the use of a mobile phone in a certain area.

Use only Samsung-approved accessories

Using incompatible accessories may damage your phone or cause injury.

Turn off the phone near medical equipment

Your phone can interfere with medical equipment in hospitals or health care facilities. Follow all regulations, posted warnings, and directions from medical personnel.

Turn off the phone or disable the wireless functions when in an aircraft

Your phone can cause interference with aircraft equipment. Follow all airline regulations and turn off your phone or switch to a mode that disables the wireless functions when directed by airline personnel.

Protect batteries and chargers from damage

- Avoid exposing batteries to very cold or very hot temperatures (below 0° C/32° F or above 45° C/113° F). Extreme temperatures can reduce the charging capacity and life of your batteries.
- Prevent batteries from contacting metal objects, as this can create a connection between the + and - terminals of your batteries and lead to temporary or permanent battery damage.
- Never use a damaged charger or battery.

Handle your phone carefully and sensibly

- Do not disassemble your phone due to a risk of electric shock.
- Do not allow your phone to get wet—liquids can cause serious damage and will change the colour of the label that indicates water damage inside the phone. Do not handle your phone with wet hands. Water damage to your phone can void your manufacturer's warranty.
- Avoid using or storing your phone in dusty, dirty areas to prevent damage to moving parts.
- Your phone is a complex electronic device—protect it from impacts and rough handling to avoid serious damage.
- Do not paint your phone, as paint can clog moving parts and prevent proper operation.

- If your phone has a camera flash or light, avoid using it to the eyes of children or animals.
- Your phone may be damaged by exposure to magnetic fields. Do not use carrying cases or accessories with magnetic closures or allow your phone to come in contact with magnetic fields for extended periods of time.

Avoid interference with other electronic devices

Your phone emits radio frequency (RF) signals that may interfere with unshielded or improperly shielded electronic equipment, such as pacemakers, hearing aids, medical devices, and other electronic devices in homes or vehicles. Consult the manufacturers of your electronic devices to solve any interference problems you experience.



Important usage information

Use your phone in the normal position

Avoid contact with your phone's internal antenna.

Allow only qualified personnel to service your phone

Allowing unqualified personnel to service your phone may result in damage to your phone and will void your warranty.

Ensure maximum battery and charger life

- Avoid charging batteries for more than a week, as overcharging may shorten battery life.
- Over time, unused batteries will discharge and must be recharged before use.

- Disconnect chargers from power sources when not in use.
- Use batteries only for their intended purpose.

Handle SIM cards and memory cards with care

- Do not remove a card while the phone is transferring or accessing information, as this could result in loss of data and/or damage to the card or phone.
- Protect cards from strong shocks, static electricity, and electrical noise from other devices.
- Frequent writing and erasing will shorten the life span of memory cards.
- Do not touch gold-coloured contacts or terminals with your fingers or metal objects. If dirty, wipe the card with a soft cloth.

Ensure access to emergency services

Emergency calls from your phone may not be possible in some areas or circumstances. Before travelling in remote or undeveloped areas, plan an alternate method of contacting emergency services personnel.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) certification information

Your phone conforms to European Union (EU) standards that limit human exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy emitted by radio and telecommunications equipment. These standards prevent the sale of mobile phones that exceed a maximum exposure level (known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR) of 2.0 W/kg.

During testing, the maximum SAR recorded for this model was 0.685 W/kg. In normal use, the actual SAR is likely to be much lower, as the phone has been designed to emit only the RF energy necessary to transmit a signal to the nearest base station. By automatically emitting lower levels when possible, your phone reduces your overall exposure to RF energy.

The Declaration of Conformity at the back of this manual demonstrates your phone's compliance with the European Radio & Terminal Telecommunications Equipment (R&TTE) directive. For more information about the SAR and related EU standards, visit the Samsung mobile phone website.

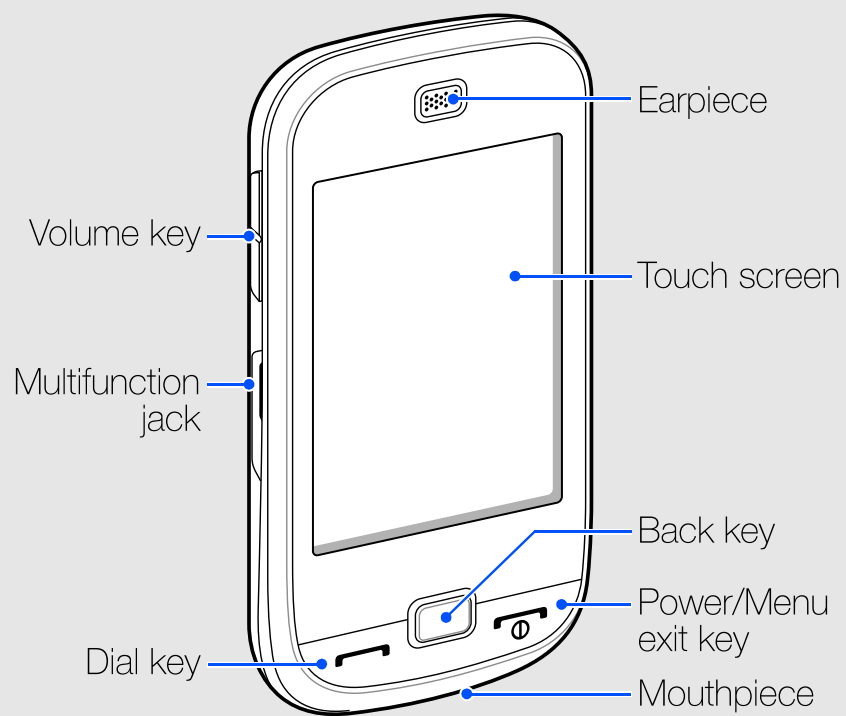

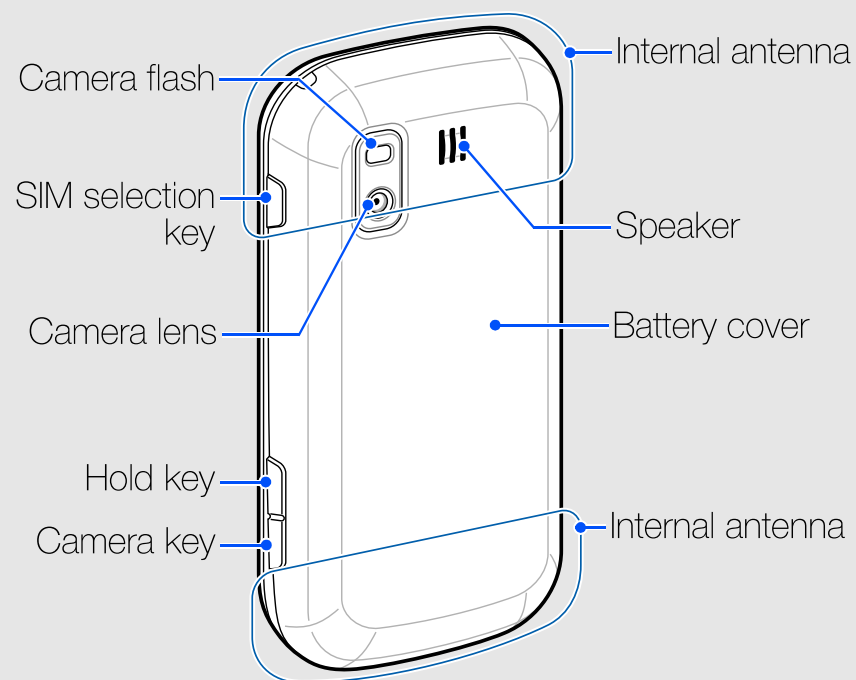

You can lock the touch screen and keys to prevent any unwanted phone operations. To lock, press [🔒]. To unlock, press and hold [🔒].

assembling and preparing your mobile phone

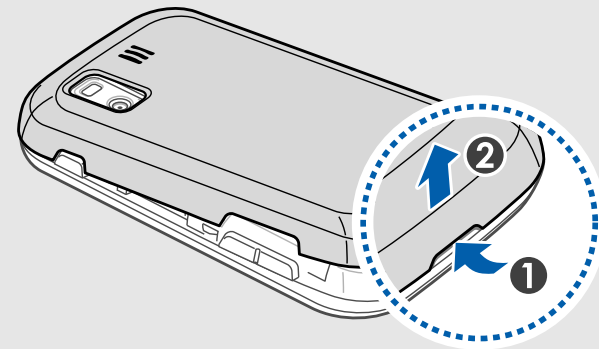
Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.

Install the SIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

To install the SIM card and battery,

1. Remove the battery cover.

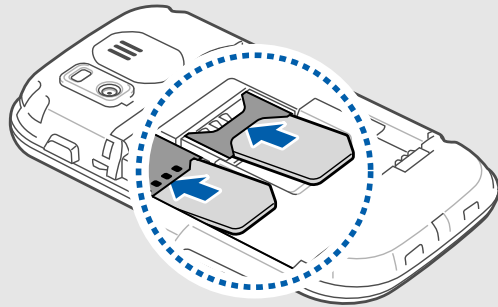


If the phone is on, press and hold [] to turn it off.

2. Insert the SIM card.

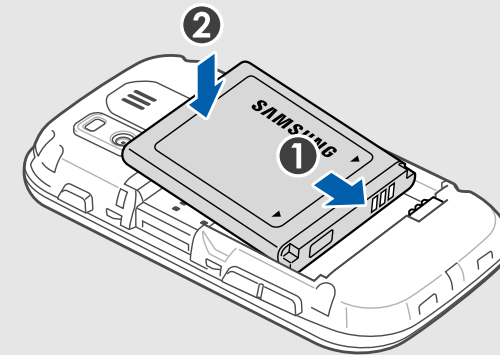
Your phone has 2 SIM card slots to allow you to use 2 SIM cards and switch between them.

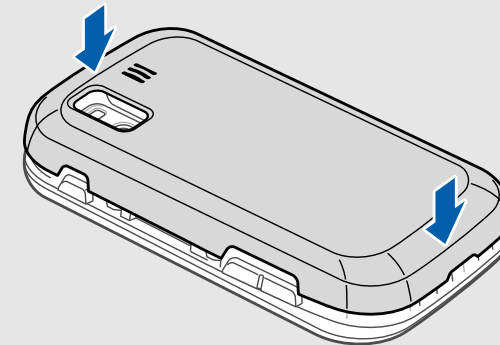


- Place the SIM cards in the phone with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.
- Once you insert 2 SIM cards, you will be prompted to select either of them when accessing network services.
- Without inserting SIM cards, you can use your phone's non-network services and some menus.

3. Insert the battery.



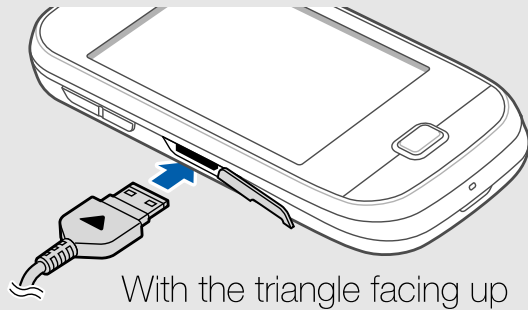
4. Replace the battery cover.



Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

1. Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the side of the phone.
2. Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.



Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.

3. Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
4. When the battery is fully charged (the  icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
5. Unplug the travel adapter from the phone.
6. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.



About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

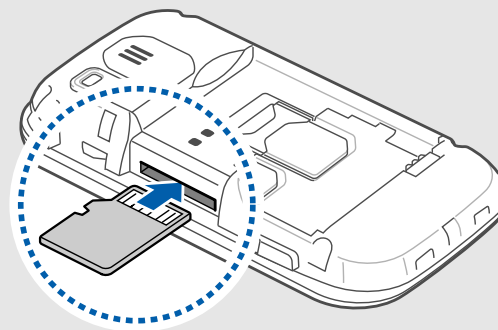
Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards up to 8 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).



Formatting the memory card on a PC may cause incompatibility with your phone. Format the memory card only on the phone.

1. Remove the battery cover.
2. Insert a memory card with the label side facing down.

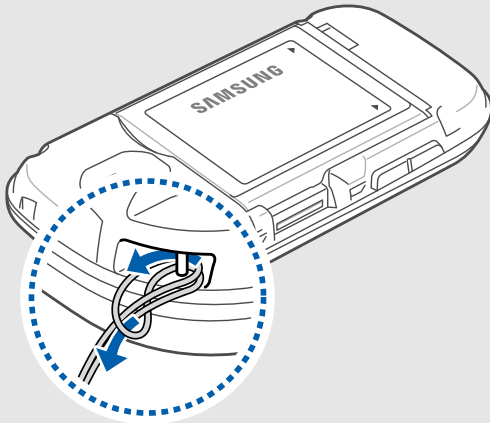


3. Push the memory card in the memory card slot until it locks in place.
4. Replace the battery cover.

To remove the memory card, push it gently until it disengages from the phone, and then pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.

Attach a hand strap (optional)

1. Remove the battery cover.
2. Slide the small end of a handstrap through the slot and push the large end through the loop.



3. Replace the battery cover.



using basic functions

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

Turn your phone on and off

To turn your phone on,

1. Press and hold [.
2. Enter your PIN and press **Done** (if necessary).
3. Press **OK**.
4. Select a slot, and assign a name and signal icon to the SIM card.
Repeat this for the other SIM card.
5. Select **Next** → **OK**.

To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.



Once you insert 2 SIM cards, you will be prompted to select either of them when accessing network services, such as calling, messaging and web services.

Switch to the offline profile

By switching to the offline profile, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.

To switch to the offline profile, in Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Phone profiles** → **Offline** → **Save**.



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

Use the touch screen

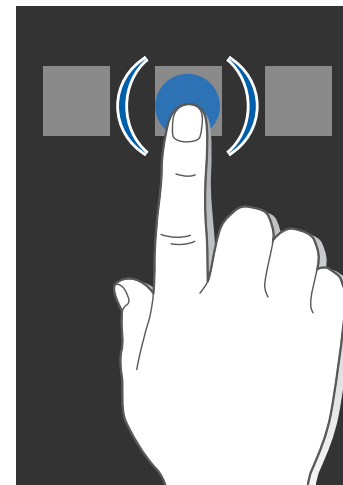
Your phone's touch screen lets you easily select items or perform functions. Learn basic actions to use the touch screen.



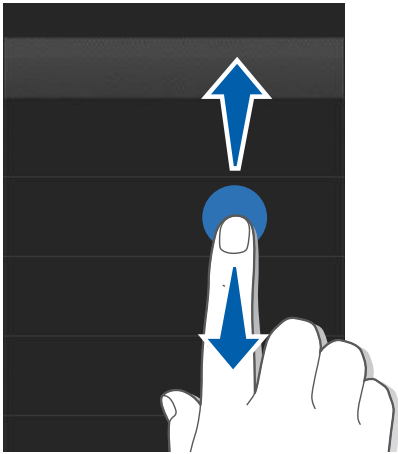
- To avoid scratching the touch screen, do not use sharp tools.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come in contact with other electrical devices. Electrostatic discharges can cause the touch screen to malfunction.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come in contact with water. The touch screen may malfunction in humid conditions or when exposed to water.



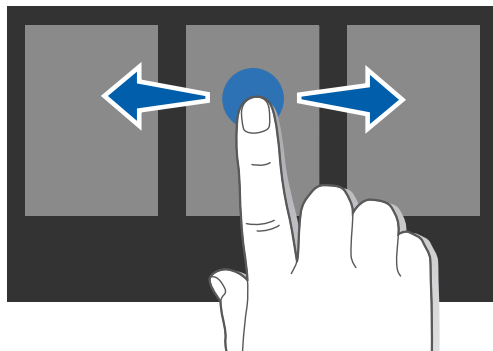
- For the optimal use of the touch screen, remove the screen protection film before using your phone.
- Your touch screen has a layer that detects small electrical charges emitted by the human body. For best performance, tap the touch screen with your fingertip. The touch screen will not react to touches of sharp tools, such as a stylus or pen.
- Touch an icon to open a menu or launch an application.



- Drag your finger up or down to scroll through vertical lists.



- Drag your finger left or right to scroll through horizontal lists.



Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

1. In Idle mode, select **Menu** to access Menu mode.
2. Select a menu or option.
3. Press the Back key to move up one level; Press [⏮] to return to Idle mode.

Use widgets

Learn to use widgets on the widget toolbar.



- Some of your widgets connect to web services. Selecting a web-based widget may incur additional charges.
- Available widgets may vary depending on your region or service provider.

Open the widget toolbar

In Idle mode, select the arrow at the bottom left of the screen to open the widget toolbar. You can rearrange widgets on the widget toolbar or move them to the idle screen.

Move the widgets to the idle screen

1. Open the widget toolbar.
2. Drag a widget from the widget toolbar to the idle screen. You can position the widget anywhere on the screen.

Change the widgets

1. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Display and light** → **Widget**.
2. Select the widgets you want to include to the widget toolbar and select **Save**.

Customise your phone

Get more from your phone by customising it to match your preferences.

Adjust the volume of the key tones

In Idle mode, press the Volume key up or down and adjust the key tone volume.

Adjust the vibration intensity on the touch screen

You can adjust the intensity of the vibration when you touch the phone screen.

1. In Idle mode, press the Volume key.
2. Select **Vibration** and adjust the intensity of the vibration.

Switch to or from the silent profile

In Idle mode, select **Keypad**, and touch and hold **#** to silence or unsilence your phone.

Set a phone profile

To change the ringtone of the current profile,

1. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Phone profiles**.
2. Scroll to the profile you are using.



If you are using the silent or offline profile, you are not allowed to change the ringtone.

3. Select **Edit** → **Voice call ringtone**.
4. Select a ringtone category → a ringtone.
5. Select **Save** twice.

To switch to another profile, select it from the list.

To create a phone profile,

1. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Phone profiles**.
2. Select **Create**.
3. Enter a name for the profile and select **Done**.
4. Customise the sound settings as desired.
5. When you are finished, select **Save**.

Select a wallpaper (Idle mode)

1. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Display and light** → **Wallpaper**.
2. Scroll left or right to an image.
3. Select **Set**.

Select a skin colour (Menu mode)

1. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Display and light** → **My theme**.
2. Select a skin colour → **Save**.

Lock your phone

1. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Security** → **Phone** → **Phone lock**.
2. Select **On** → **Save**.
3. Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and select **Done**.
4. Enter the new password again and select **Done**.



- The first time you access a menu that requires a password, you will be prompted to create and confirm a password.
- Samsung is not responsible for any loss of passwords or private information or other damages caused by illegal software.

Manage your SIM cards

Your phone supports the Dual SIM mode, enabling you to use two SIM cards at the same time without changing them. Learn to select a default SIM card and network, and set the SIM cards settings.

Select a default SIM card and network

1. In Idle mode, press and hold [F].
2. Select **Network** → a SIM card you want.
3. Select **Activate** under the SIM card.
4. Select the default network field until a SIM card you want appears.
5. Select **Save** → **Yes**.
Your phone will automatically reboot.

Switch the SIM cards automatically

1. In Idle mode, press and hold [F].
2. Select **SIM auto switch** → **Change**.

3. Select a SIM card slot.
4. Specify the schedule that the SIM card will be active and select **Save**.

Change the names and icons of the SIM cards

1. In Idle mode, press and hold [].
2. Select **Register card**.
3. Select a SIM card.
4. Select **Card name** and change the name for the SIM card and select **Done**.
5. Select **Icon** and change the icon for the SIM card and select **Save**.

Use basic call functions

Learn to make or answer calls and use basic call functions.

Make a call

1. In Idle mode, select **Keypad** and enter an area code and a phone number.
2. Press [] to dial the number
3. To end the call, press [].

Answer a call

1. When a call comes in, press [].
2. To end the call, press [].

Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume key up or down.

Use the speakerphone feature

1. During a call, select  → **Yes** to activate the speaker.
2. To switch back to the earpiece, select  again.



In noisy environments, you may have difficulty hearing the calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better performance, use the normal phone mode.

Use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the phone, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press and hold the headset button.
- To answer a call, press the headset button.
- To end a call, press the headset button.

Send and view messages

Learn to send or view text (SMS), multimedia (MMS), or email messages.

Send a text or multimedia message

1. In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **Create new message** → **Message**.
2. Select the recipient input field → **Enter manually**.
3. Enter a recipient number and select **Done**.
4. Select **Tap to add text**.
5. Enter your message text and select **Done**.

For sending as a text message, skip to step 7.
For attaching multimedia, continue with step 6.
6. Select **Add multimedia** and add an item.
7. Select **Send** to send the message.

Send an email

1. In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **Create new message** → **Email**.
2. Select the recipient input field → **Enter manually**.
3. Enter an email address and select **Done**.
4. Select **Tap to add subject**, enter a subject, and select **Done**.
5. Select **Tap to add text**, enter your email text, and select **Done**.
6. Select **Attach multimedia** and attach a file (if necessary).
7. Select **Send** to send the message.

Enter text

When entering text, you can change the text input mode:

- To change case or use numbers or symbols, select **T9ab** at the bottom centre of the screen. Depending on your region, you may be able to access an input mode for your specific language.
- To enter text in T9 mode, select **T9** (**T9** turns blue).
- To switch to Symbol mode, select .

Enter text in one of the following modes:

Mode	Function
ABC	Select an appropriate virtual key until the character you want appears on the display.

Mode	Function
T9	1. Select appropriate virtual keys to enter an entire word. 2. When the word displays correctly, select  to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, select 0 to select an alternate word from the list that appears.
Number	Select an appropriate virtual key to enter a number.
Symbol	Select an appropriate virtual key to enter a symbol.

View text or multimedia messages

1. In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **My messages** → **Inbox**.
2. Select a text or multimedia message.

View an email

1. In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **My messages** → **Email inbox**.
2. Select an account.
3. Select **Download**.
4. Select an email or a header.
5. If you selected a header, select **Retrieve** to view the body of the email.

Add and find contacts

Learn the basics of using the phonebook feature.



The memory location to save new contacts may be preset depending on your service provider. To change the memory location, in Menu mode, select **Phonebook** → **More** → **Settings** → **Save new contacts to** → a memory location → **Save**.

Add a new contact

1. In Idle mode, select **Keypad** and enter a phone number.
2. Select **More** → **Add to Phonebook** → a memory location (if necessary) → **New**.
3. Select a number type (if necessary).
4. Enter contact information.
5. Select **Save** to add the contact to memory.

Find a contact

1. In Menu mode, select **Phonebook**.
2. Select **Search**.
3. Enter the first few letters of the name you want to find and select **Done**.
4. Select the contact's name from the search list.



Once you have found a contact, you can:

- call the contact by pressing [**☎**]
- edit the contact information by selecting **Edit**

Use basic camera functions

Learn the basics to capture and view photos and videos.

Capture photos

1. In Idle mode, press and hold the Camera key to turn on the camera.
2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
3. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
 - To set the exposure value, select [**☒**].
 - To zoom in or out, press the Volume key.

4. Press the Camera key to take a photo.
The photo is saved automatically.
5. Press the Back key or the Camera key to take another photo (step 3).

After capturing photos, select  to view photos.

View photos

In Menu mode, select **My files** → a memory location → **Images** → **My photos** → a photo file.

Capture videos

1. In Idle mode, press and hold the Camera key to turn on the camera.
2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
3. Select  →  to switch to Recording mode.

4. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
 - To set the exposure value, select .
 - To zoom in or out, press the Volume key.

5. Press the Camera key to start recording.

6. Press the Camera key or select  to stop recording.

The video is saved automatically.

7. Press the Back key or the Camera key to record another video (step 4).

After capturing videos, select  to view videos.

View videos

In Menu mode, select **My files** → a memory location → **Videos** → **My video clips** → a video file.



Your phone can play 320 X 240 resolution video files at 12 frames per second.

Listen to music

Learn how to listen to music via the music player or FM radio.

Listen to the FM radio

1. Plug the supplied headset into the phone's multifunction jack.
2. In Menu mode, select **FM radio**.
3. Press  to turn on the FM radio.
4. Select **Yes** to start automatic tuning.
The radio scans and saves available stations automatically.
5. Control the FM radio using the following icons and keys:

Icon	Function
	Tune a radio station manually; Tune a radio station automatically (touch and hold) ► p. 47

Icon	Function
	Turn the FM radio on
	Turn the FM radio off
	Change the sound output

6. To turn off the FM radio, select .

Listen to music files

Start by transferring files to your phone or memory card:

- Download from the wireless web. ► p. 34
- Download from a PC with the optional Samsung Kies. ► p. 45
- Receive via Bluetooth. ► p. 49
- Copy to your memory card. ► p. 45

After transferring music files to your phone or memory card,

1. In Menu mode, select **Music**.
2. Select a music category → a music file.
3. Control playback using the following icons and keys:

	Skip forward; Scan forward in a file (touch and hold)

Browse the web

Learn to access and bookmark your favourite web pages.



- You may incur additional charges for accessing the web and downloading media.
- The browser menu may be labelled differently depending on your service provider.
- Available icons may vary depending on your region or service provider.

Browse web pages

1. In Menu mode, select **Internet** → **Home** to launch your service provider's homepage.
2. Navigate web pages using the following icons:

Bookmark your favourite web pages

1. In Menu mode, select **Internet** → **Bookmarks** → a SIM card (if necessary).
2. Select **Create**.
3. Enter a page title and a web address (URL).
4. Select **Save**.

Use the Google services

Learn how to use various Google services.



- This feature may not be available depending on your region or service provider.
- The steps you must select to use this feature may differ depending on your region or service provider.

Connect to Google Search

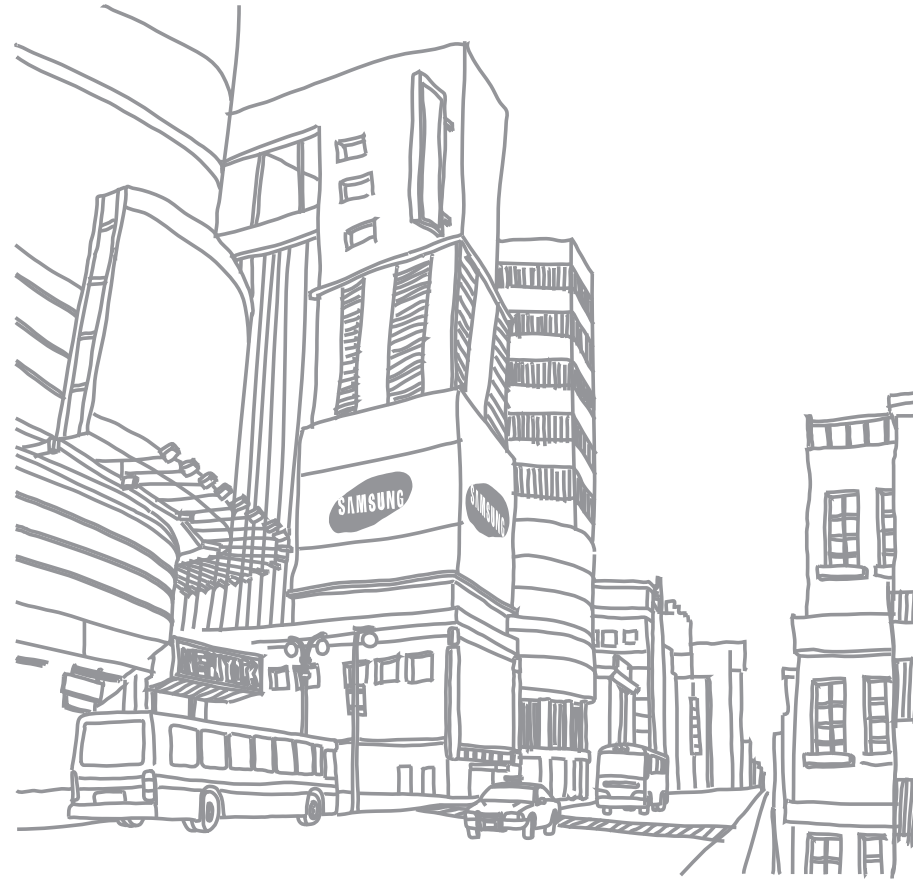
